Key Open Invitation To Stealing of Auto

Memphis, Tenn.—(U.P.)—A key left in an automobile ignition switch is an open invitation for loss of your car and a police record for teen-aged boys and girls.

Roy C. Nelms, U. S. probation officer, said "kids who wouldn't steal a pencil" often find the temptation of a key in the ignition switch too great to resist.

He said more youths than ever before are ending up behind bars with stiff federal sentences for violation of the Dyer act by transporting a stolen car across state lines.

Nelms, whose job it is to furnish federal court with a detailed past history of each person brought in on a criminal charge, listed sex and envy as the major cause of teen-age violators.

A boy will steal an automobile meaning only to date a girl whose other boy friends romanced her in a car, he said. Eventually the youth will cross a state line in the car.

Boys and girls sentenced here for violation of the Dyer act commonly are given three year terms. Some get the maximum penalty—five years.

The veteran law enforcement officer said the best way to combat the growing wave of teen-aged car thefts is for every individual to remove his car keys when he gets out of the car, regardless of how long he plans to be gone.

Hollywood — (U.P.) — New French-Canadian star Suzanne Cloutier confessed Friday she was so frightened when she arrived by train in this country that she lived in Grand Central Station for two weeks.

Legs Said Not Lost Horses With Broken

Milwaukee — (U.P.) — An Ohio veterinarian and educator says the modern farmer doesn't have to shoot a horse if it breaks a leg.

"Many leg fractures can be fixed up as good as new with modern veterinary surgery practices," Dr. W. F. Guard, chairman of the surgery department at Ohio State University's college of veterinary medicine, said.

Dr. Guard spoke at a meeting of the Wisconsin Veterinary Medical association.

"Some serious fractures may leave a horse with a limp despite modern practices," Dr. Guard said, "but even some seemingly hopeless cases are worth treatment."
