Philadelphia — (U.P.) — Heavyweight Champion Jersey Joe Walcott after unsuccessful negotiations for a bout with Harry (Kid) Matthews or Rocky Marciano, was ready Saturday to give Ezzard Charles his long-delayed return shot at the title.

Promoter Herman Taylor announced that the 38-year-old Walcott and the 30-year-old Charles will sign next Monday for a June title fight at Philadelphia's Municipal stadium.

Taylor withheld the actual date of the bout until the formal signing at City Hall headquarters of the Police Athletic league, which will benefit from the gate receipts. But in New York, Charles' manager, Jake Mintz, indicated it would be on June 9.

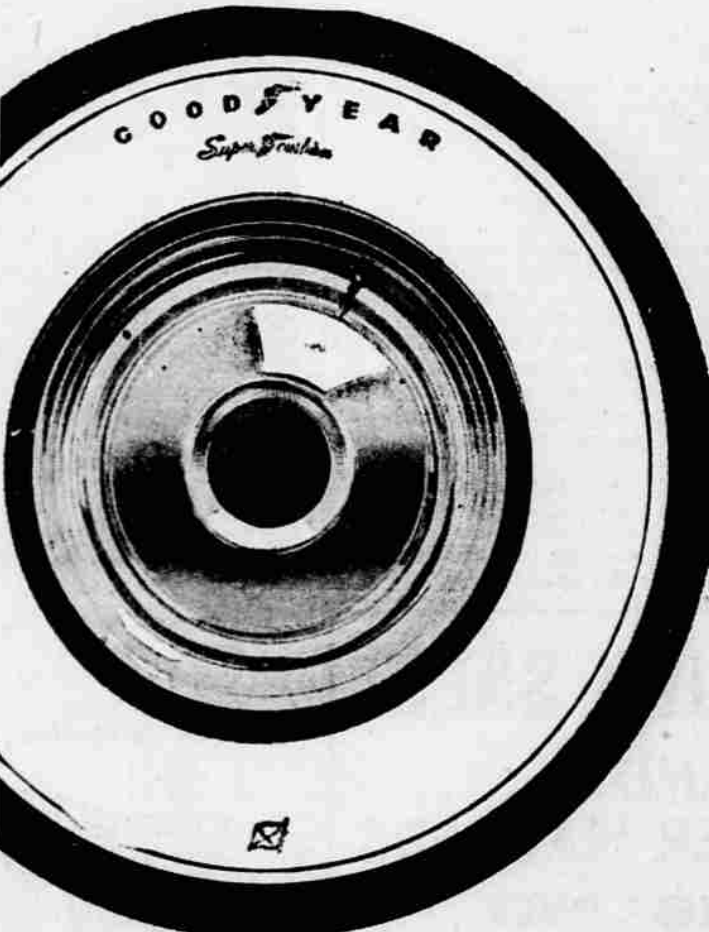
