Greyhound Reaches Agreement To Buy Two Stage Routes

Chicago—(U.P.)—Greyhound Corp. has announced it has reached an agreement with the Union Pacific railroad to buy the road's stock interest in Interstate Transit Lines and Union Pacific Stages.

The two properties are inter-city bus lines now operated jointly under the name of Overland Greyhound Lines. The purchase would be subject to approval by the Interstate Commerce Commission.

Greyhound Owns Stock
Union Pacific owns 51 per cent of Interstate Transit and 66 2/3 per cent of Union Pacific Stages. Since 1943, Greyhound has owned 33 1/3 per cent of the stock of both companies.

The balance has been held by the Chicago and Northwestern railway.

Negotiations Conducted
Greyhound said negotiations for purchase of the Northwestern's interest are being conducted, and are expected to be terminated successfully within a few days.

Interstate Transit operates between Chicago and Los Angeles via Omaha and Salt Lake City, with connections to other points. Union Pacific Stages runs from Salt Lake City to Portland, Ore., and Spokane, Wash.

Day of Russian Diet Brings Round of Gripes From GIs

Schofield Barracks, Hawaii—(U.P.)—The Army believes every American GI who goes through basic training here leaves with at least one good example of "what I am fighting for" under his belt.

All it takes is the one-day dose of Russian Army food which every prospective combat infantryman has been getting in recent months before the windup of his 16-week light weapons course at the Hawaiian Infantry Training Center.

Breakfast Grips
The mess sergeants beam on this day when they hear the 1,300 members of the 60th Infantry Battalion gripe as they never have done before over breakfast. The morning menu is boiled beets, rice porridge, pea soup, black bread and one cup of tea.

For lunch it's borscht, boiled potatoes with sour cream sauce, dark bread and water—plus more gripes.

None of the GIs in the company messes eats very heartily. **Forced Sampling**
But the prospect of a 20-mile

night march shortly after dinner causes some forced sampling of the menu of vegetable-macaroni soup, fish stew, boiled cabbage and more dark bread and tea.

Lt. Col. Charles W. Davis, a World War II Medal of Honor winner who is in charge of the Center's training program, said the GI Ivan menu gives the men "a pretty good idea of what they are fighting for."

The car was involved in a crash with a truck, the story said, and a total of five vehicles were damaged. The Washburn car was most seriously damaged.

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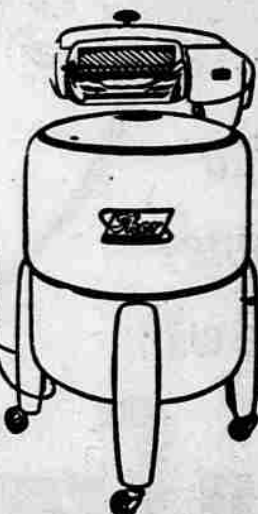
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Talent Farm Bureau Sets 'Victory' Dinner
