

Student Lives Eight Days With Slain Wife

Chicago—(U.P.)—A 35-year-old University of Chicago student told police how he killed his pretty wife, then slept, ate and studied for eight days while her half-clad body lay on the bedroom floor.

Harold Roland Markham led Police Lt. Frank O'Sullivan to his South Side apartment where the body of his wife, Mary Elizabeth Markham, 37, was found clad in a black slip and white blouse.

She had been shot three times, once in the face and twice in the body.

Pistol Under Bed
A nickel-plated pistol lay under a bed. Three empty cartridges were on the floor along with a penciled note.

"Three for your comfort," it said.

Markham told police he referred to the three bullets he fired into his wife.

SOC Faculty Men In Extension Work

Ashland—Six faculty members at Southern Oregon college are teaching courses for the general extension division of the Oregon State System of Higher Education this spring, according to Dr. Elmo N. Stevenson, college president. Classes are being held in six Southern Oregon communities.

On Saturday, Dr. Bill A. Sampson, assistant professor of education, teaches a graduate course in school finance at the college.

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Accident Victim Is 50th Patient Carried by Plane

The Mercy Flights twin-engine Cessna ambulance plane carried the organization's 50th patient on a flight to Vancouver, B. C., yesterday.

The non-profit firm was called from Roseburg and the plane left here at 7:30 a. m. yesterday, arriving there at 8 a. m. The patient, Charles Percival Moody, was loaded aboard the plane after being transferred to the stretcher at the hospital, and immobilized.

Moody was seriously injured including a broken pelvis and fractured skull about two weeks ago in an automobile accident in which his wife was killed.

Trip Back
The plane left Roseburg at 9 a. m., landed in Seattle for customs inspection, and arrived in Vancouver at 12:15 p. m., where Moody was moved to another hospital.

The return trip was made from Vancouver to Roseburg, where Mrs. Marguerite Dorsey, the nurse who attended Moody, deplaned, and arrived here at 7:15 p. m.

George Milligan was pilot on the trip and Tony Bullis was co-pilot. The flight was about 1,000 miles round trip.

Radio Studios Near Completion at SOC
Ashland—Installation of new equipment in the radio studios located in the new library-classroom building at Southern Oregon college will be the final step in completing the rooms, according to Donald E. Lewis, business manager.

Acoustic tile has been placed in the two main broadcast studios and control rooms, Lewis said. Cork floor covering was also added to decrease unnecessary noise.

Installation of professional type control panels and turntables awaits inspection of the plant by Grant Feickert, director of radio station KOAC at Oregon State college. Elliott B. Maccracken, assistant professor of mathematics, will be in charge of the technical details here.

They returned and circled the field until most of the fuel was used up then made a belly landing and walked away uninjured. The plane was only slightly damaged.

Oregon Builders Granted Pay Boost

Portland — (U.P.) — Construction workers in Oregon Friday were due for a 10 cents an hour pay boost retroactive to the first week in January.

The increase was approved Thursday by the wage stabilization board.

The boost makes the scale for AFL construction workers \$1.85 an hour, except for those working in sewers or on swinging scaffolds. For the latter, the scale will be \$2 an hour.
