Latest developments in the presidential race:

DEMOCRATS

Stevenson — Supporters of Gov. Adlai E. Stevenson of Illinois hoped their campaign for write-in votes in Tuesday's Illinois primary would produce enough backing at the polls to persuade him to run for president.

Kefauver — Sen. Estes Kefauver's backers forecast another primary victory for the Tennesseean, whose only opposition in the Illinois contest was the write-in effort for Stevenson.

Russell — Sen. Richard B. Russell of Georgia predicted he will enter the Democratic Convention with a fourth to a third of the "firm" delegates.

REPUBLICANS

Taft — Supporters of Sen. Robert A. Taft of Ohio pooh-poohed claims by the Eisenhower camp that Gen. Dwight D. Eisenhower will have "more than 500" pledged delegates when the GOP convention opens.

Eisenhower — New Jersey Attorney General Theodore D. Parsons ruled that Democratic voters may write in the general's name in that state's primary April 15.

Stassen — Harold E. Stassen, another entry in the Illinois primary, started a five-day tour of New Jersey seeking support in the contest there.

Joan Crawford To Get Beauticians' Award

Garden Included

Its grounds include a neatly manicured garden, a tennis court, a putting green which Mamie had installed as a surprise for the general, and a pond stocked with trout. She has given the villa characteristic feeling of "home away from home."

Mamie long has said the life of an Army officer's wife is mostly concerned with taking care of little things, letting her husband concentrate on major decisions connected with his career.

The "little things" range from making sure Ike's breakfast is hot to carry responsibility for dinners which may include an American senator one night and the head of a foreign government the next.

Misses Family

Mrs. Eisenhower misses most seeing her son and daughter-in-law and two grandchildren — "any grandmother will know how I feel about that—that's known as grandmother's disease."

She sometimes is wistful for the farm near Gettysburg, Pa., which she and Ike bought shortly before he took over the European command post. She is conscious, too, of the big pay cut he took when he left Columbia University, and gets good use out of her mail-order charge accounts in New York.



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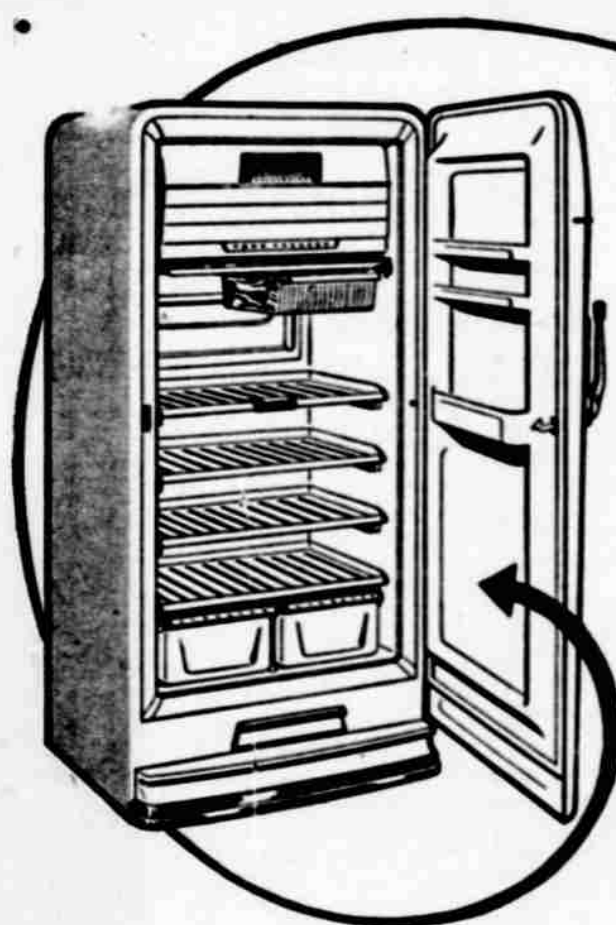
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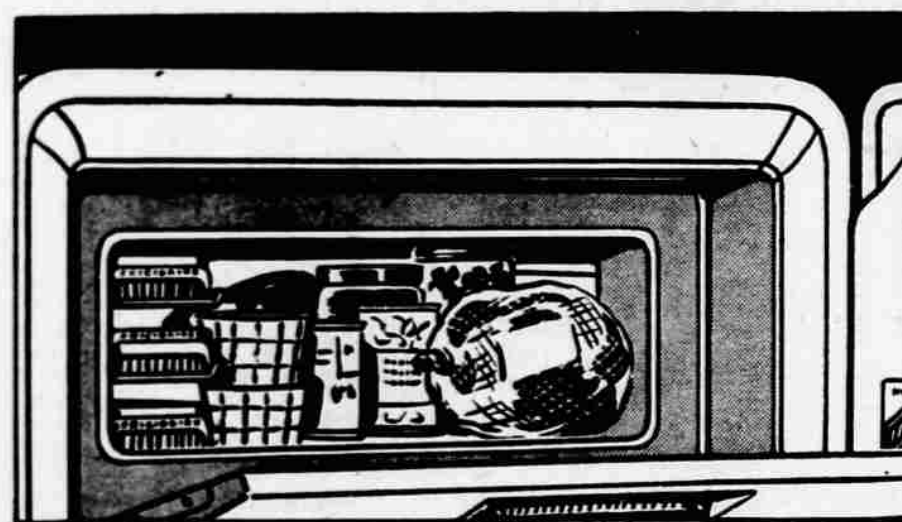
