

Action of Individuals in Event of Emergency Told

Salem—(U.P.)—The Oregon civil defense agency has summarized action to be taken by the individual citizen in the event of any large-scale emergency.

1—Learn the basic rudiments of fire fighting and strive for "fire-safe housekeeping." A clean building seldom burns.

2—Do not be an amateur FBI agent, but if you see any instances of subversive action report them to nearest police station or sheriff's office.

3—After a disaster, disregard rumors heard on street corners.

4—After an emergency, remain at home. Highways will be used by emergency vehicles headed toward stricken areas.

5—Stay off the telephone during an emergency.

6—Take a first aid or home nursing course from your local Red Cross chapter.

7—Set aside three to five days' food supply for emergency use only.

8—After an air raid alert, those in metropolitan areas should shut off household appliances, such as un-plugging irons and turning off stove burners, just as if they were leaving for a day. Do not turn off main switches. Basement is safest spot for shelter. Even a study desk or table is better than nothing.

11 Valley Events Listed in State's Summer Schedule

Eleven Rogue valley events are included in the 1952 Oregon schedule of events released this week by the State Highway Department's travel information division. The pamphlet is published annually for the benefit of tourists.

Events listed for June and July in this area include the 10th annual Rogue River Round-Up, slated in Medford June 14 and 15; the national Cattfish Derby, at Bybee bridge on the Rogue river at an undetermined date; the Rogue Rod and Gun club jamboree, July 4 at Grants Pass, and the Ashland Fourth of July celebration, July 4 through 6.

Six events are listed during August. They include the Grants Pass Gladiolus festival, August 1 and 2; the Oregon Shakespearean festival, August 1 through 30 in Ashland; the Jackson County Fair and Rodeo, August 19 through 22 in Grants Pass; the Jackson County 4-H and FFA fair, August 19 through 23 in Medford, and the Josephine County Sheriff's Posse rodeo, August 21 and 22.

Included in the pamphlet for September is the Ashland Centennial celebration, commemorating the 100th anniversary of the city.

Newby Raps Lack Of Enforcement of License Renewals

Salem—(U.P.)—Secretary of State Earl T. Newby has charged Portland city and Multnomah county police authorities with laxity in enforcing the laws about auto license plate renewals.

Newby said that last December 21 he notified heads of those agencies that he had received several complaints from Portland pointing out cases of motor vehicles operating in Multnomah county with delinquent license plates. He asked the cooperation of those agencies in correcting the situation but said he has had no replies from the heads of the agencies or from state police.

Newby said he had been told that state police do not operate within the city of Portland but leave all enforcement to the Portland city police department and the Multnomah county sheriff's office.

Elsewhere in Oregon, Newby said, renewals are being made on or before the expiration date of the license plates.

Rosenbergs Appeal To Supreme Court

New York—(U.P.)—Convicted atom spies Ethel and Julius Rosenberg turned to the nation's highest court Wednesday in their fight to avoid the death sentence for passing wartime secrets to Russia.

If the Supreme Court refuses to reverse their conviction the couple, barring presidential intervention, will be executed in Sing Sing prison as the first U. S. civilians ever sentenced to death for spying on their country.

Neighborhood Scanned For Missing Youngster

Highland Park, Calif.—(U.P.)—Police, firemen and volunteers searched the El Sereno district from door-to-door Wednesday for a missing three-year-old girl who is feared kidnapped.

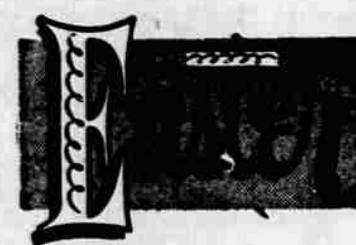
