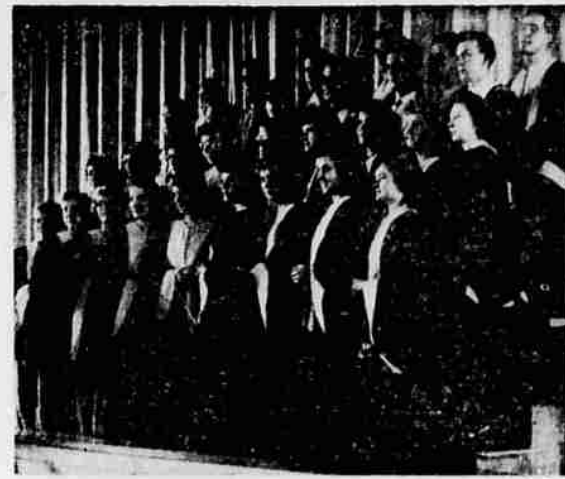
Roosevelt Memorial Dinner Scheduled By Democrats Here
