DON'T TAKE MARRIED MEN TOO SERIOUSLY

A married man may play the serious game with a young and glib girl but he knows that he cannot be serious with her and he rarely ever has any thoughts but of a good time. The young girl, however, does not realize this, as is true of the girl who wrote the following letter:

(Q) "We are two 16 year old girls and our problem is much the same. There are two men, 25 and 28 years old, who have had their eyes on us for several years. Both are married and have families. We both go steady with two wonderful boys. These two men are always telling us how they wish they didn't have to go home to their present wives, etc. We are very fond of these men and would be very relieved to have an adult's advice as things are getting worse in stead of better. We go out with them and would like to know what you think we should do."

(A) I think you should stop seeing these married men at once. Nothing will come of your romances with them but a broken heart and a bad reputation. These men have no thoughts of leaving their wives and children for you no matter what they tell you.

You may not realize it but, when a man marries, he legally assumes the responsibility of taking care of his wife and any children he may have. He cannot walk out on his family because he finds a pretty face and an amusing companion.

These men like to amuse themselves with you two young girls. But, have you ever thought what people will say when they see you with them? And, if their wives hear what is happening, they can make things difficult for you.

You have two young boys who care enough for you to want to go steady with you. Isn't that enough? If they should find out that you are going out with married men, the chances are that they will drop you. And so will

the others in your community. Then where will you be?

The fact that things are getting worse rather than better with these two married men ought to be a danger warning. Run to shelter now, while you have a chance, and don't risk your whole future for the sake of a little excitement and a few thrills.

Dakota, Wyoming Favorable for Uranium

Washington — (U.P.) — Recent discoveries of uranium in South Dakota and Wyoming "point to a whole area that is favorable for prospecting for uranium," the geological survey said Tuesday.

The agency made the statement in a discussion of recent discoveries of uranium-bearing ores in the two states. Carnotite, one of the principal uranium ores in this country, was found last June in Craven Canyon near Edgemont, S. D. Other uranium deposits were discovered about 100 miles away in the Pumpkin Butte area of Northeastern Wyoming.

Singapore — (U.P.) — Communist terrorists burned the railroad station Tuesday at Layang Layang, Johore state, one of the worst trouble spots in Malaya.

Police said there were no casualties. British high commissioner or Malaya, Gen. Sir Gerald Templer, recently visited Layang Layang. There have been several instances of arson and murder reported from the city.

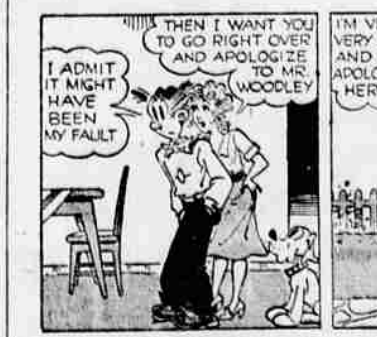

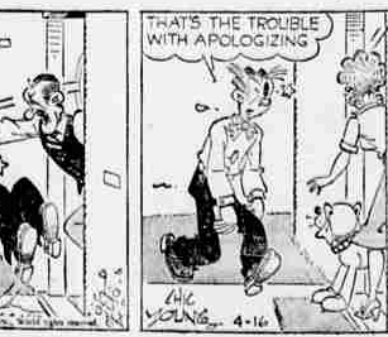

COMMON RESPIRATORY INFECTIONS

A suitable mask, such as the transparent, washable Silvers mask described in the C-R-I book (for the book-let send 25¢ and stamped self-addressed envelope) should be worn as a legally prescribed part of the working uniform of every individual who renders indoor personal service—dentist, physician, nurse, barber, manicure, hairdresser, grocery clerk, bank clerk, school teacher, business executive, stenographer, optician, waiter, tailor, fitter, salesperson.

I suppose this suggestion will seem absurd to most readers as long as the health authorities and physicians continue to be squeamish about the prevention of respiratory infection. What the heck! Aren't you forgetting that three-fourths of the doctors' everyday practice comes from the C-R-I—Common Respiratory Infections?

Not that I expect the uneducated public—and the public is uneducated about this—to begin wearing even the inconspicuous mask I recommend—in any great numbers in my time. But I like to believe that every time I harp on the subject like this a few young readers may begin to think about it, young ones, I say they're my meat—you old ones are incorrigible anyway.

You old fogies, medical or lay, will be pleased with the tenor of the advice offered by the great insurance corporation in

this winter's campaign against pneumonia:
"Dress warmly when going out, especially during cold, damp weather."
Contrast this quaint quibble of the insurance corporation with the advice of a distinguished British authority on physiology, hygiene, ventilation and kindred subjects, Dr. Leonard Hill:
"It is absurd to put on an overcoat when going out for a walk. It is good to go out and be braced by feeling cold and so be impelled to take vigorous exercise."
I'm not morbid or obsessed about this walk suggestion, yet it does seem that one may avoid many a mild or severe illness by keeping beyond conversation spray range in circumstances where this is feasible and there is a reasonable doubt as to the nature of the so-and-so's ailment.

I may be as nutty as a school-girl's sundae, but I do believe this would be a healthier, happier world if all the old fogies and mollycoddles, medical and lay, were as conscious of conversation spray as they are of wet feet, drafts and sudden changes.
