Former Chaplain Will Preach at Nazarene Service

The Rev. Mark R. Moore, of Ponca City, Okla., former Army chaplain who was twice imprisoned by the Germans in World War II, will speak Sunday at 11 a. m. at the Medford Church of the Nazarene, according to the pastor, The Rev. Vernon Wilcox.

The district superintendent, The Rev. W. D. McGraw Jr., of Portland, will also participate in the service, which will be broadcast over radio station KYJC.

While with the Army, Captain Moore was twice captured, twice bombed, and twice liberated. His second liberation was effected by the 88th division, in which his brother, Major J. E. Moore Jr., was serving as chaplain.

Writes Book

The unexpected meeting of the two brothers, as well as many other war experiences, is related in his book, "Prisoner of the Germans." After the war, he was professor of Biblical literature at Bethany-Peniel college until 1948. Since that time he has been serving as superintendent of the Northwest Oklahoma district of the Nazarene denomination.

Other services of the day will include Sunday school at 9:45 a. m., youth meetings at 6:30 p. m., and an evangelistic service at 7:30 p. m., with the pastor bringing a message on the theme: "What Jesus Taught About Hell."

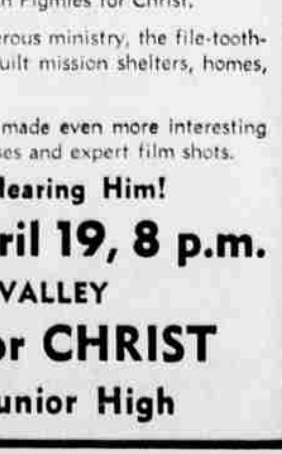

Special music will include an anthem, "Unfold, 'Ye Portals," by the Chancel choir, and a number, "Victory by the Cross," by the Chapel trio.

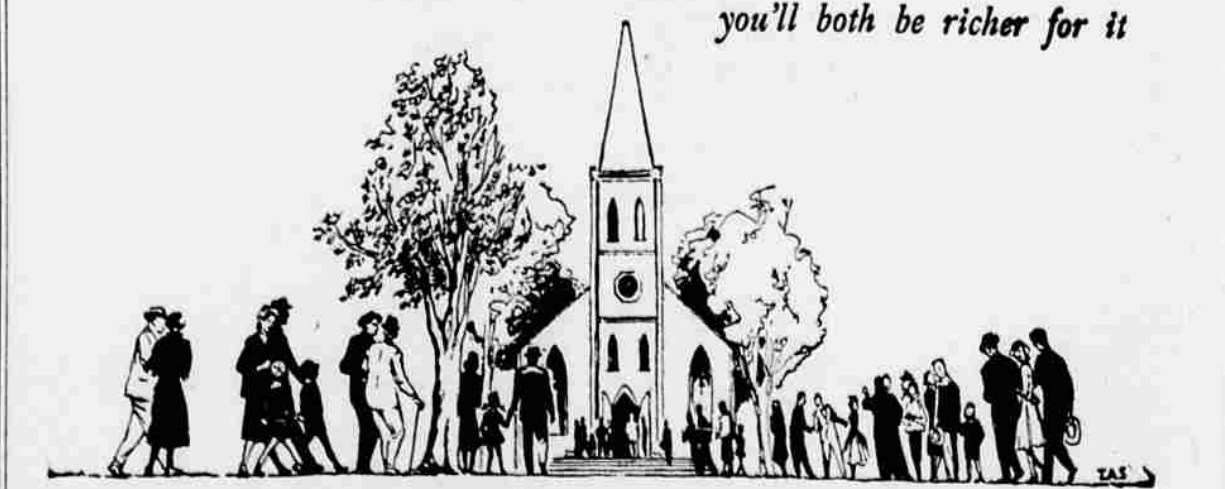
