

## Copco Would Be Involved in Tiein Of Power Circuit

Wenatchee —(U.P.)— The Pacific Gas and Electric company of California has submitted to the House Appropriations committee a proposal for construction of a power transmission intertie between its system and utilities systems in Oregon.

**Basic Implications**

The action was disclosed here Thursday night by Rep. Henry Jackson, D-Wash. He said the committee feels the proposal has "basic national power policy implications" and should be submitted to further "exhaustive study."

**Copco Offered Contract**

Jackson said Robert Gerdes, general counsel of P.G.E., told the committee Feb. 11 that his company has offered the California-Oregon Power company a contract which proposes construction of a tie line. The Everett congressman quoted Gerdes as saying the line would make possible the delivery to the Bonneville system in Oregon and Washington of 120,000 to 140,000 kilowatts of California-generated electricity.

## Bold Mail Robber Seized in Oklahoma

Oklahoma City, Okla.—(U.P.)— A Chicagoan dubbed as Oklahoma City's "boldest mail robber" was jailed Friday after admitting he calmly shouldered a mail bag at a main street collection box and walked away with it as hundreds of persons watched.

The suspect, 25-year-old Richard W. Walters, was arrested Wednesday when he and a companion fled from a department store after attempting to cash a \$191 check taken from the stolen mail bag. The other man, also believed to be from Illinois, escaped.

Walters was arraigned before U.S. Commissioner Paul Showalter and pleaded guilty to mail theft.

## Earth Slides Send Land Into Columbia

Kettle Falls, Wash.—(U.P.)— Giant earth slides on the west bank of the Columbia river eight miles south of here have sent 20 acres of land splashing into the river in the last five days, Stevens county sheriff's deputies estimated Friday.

Deputies said banks as high as 250 feet have disappeared in the second series of slides in the area in the last year. The largest slides in the current series occurred Wednesday.

Officers said the slides, caused by a mysterious seepage of water through the soggy banks, pushed five acres of an alfalfa field into the river and chewed out 150 feet of the Kettle Falls-Inchelium highway.

## Plan To Beat Immigration Laws Leaves Man Married To Woman He Doesn't Love

Fergus Falls, Minn.—(U.P.)—A 31-year-old farmer has disclosed an elaborate plan to beat the immigration laws which left him with a wife he didn't love and not on speaking terms with the woman he did love.

Lyle V. Danielson filed a complaint which said he succumbed to the urgings of a Minnesota woman he was in love with, and married her sister, a Greek national.

**Later Divorce Planned**

The scheme called for him to divorce the sister later and marry the Minnesota woman.

The plan backfired after he went through with the marriage. The woman he loved wouldn't

even write to him, Danielson said.

Danielson asked the District Court to void his wedding to Chrisavage Timbell, Athens, Greece, because her sister, whom he loves, tricked him into the marriage.

He said the sister, whom he would not name, begged him to go to Nassau in the British Bahamas and marry Chrisavage so that the 28-year-old Greek could enter the United States.

**Saw Pictures**

According to Danielson's suit, the sister, who lives in Duluth, Minn., showed him pictures of Chrisavage.

He said he wasn't impressed with the pictures but fell quickly in love with the Duluth woman, and they hatched the plot.

He said he married the Greek woman in the Bahamas Sept. 15, 1950, returned to Minnesota shortly afterward without his bride and learned to his dismay that the Duluth woman would not marry him and even refused to write him.

## Tavern Owner Sells Beer for Five Cents

Tacoma —(U.P.)— Despite objections from competitors and distributors, tavern owner Andrew Berg was selling beer for a nickel a glass Friday "so the working man would have a chance to get something for his money."

He slashed his prices Thursday. But a few hours after the bargain beer made its appearance two distributors told him they would not supply him with beer anymore, Berg said.

"One of my competitors called me on the phone and accused me of starting a beer war," he said.

## General Sees Korea Truce by June 30

Atlanta, Ga.—(U.P.)—An Army general, who served as a truce negotiator for two months in Korea, said Friday a cease-fire may be reached by June 30.

Maj. Gen. Claude B. Ferenbaugh said "and if the Chinese make an agreement they might live up to it, at least in Korea."

The former 7th Infantry commander, now attached to Army Field forces at Ft. Monroe, Va., is visiting 3rd Army headquarters here.

## Senator Opposes Policy of Leasing Federal Storage

Washington —(U.P.)— Sen. John J. Williams, R-Del., believes it was "wrong for the Agriculture Department to lease six government-owned elevators to private operators, then lease back part of them to store grain."

**Shown in Report**

Williams said in a Senate speech that a report from the comptroller general's office shows that six elevators owned by the Farm Credit Administration, a division of the Agriculture Department, were leased to private operators in 1949, 1950 and 1951.

He said the Commodity Credit Corp., another Agriculture Division, rented space in them during the same years to store grain. Williams said there is no evidence that the rents paid by the CCC were "out of line."

The report showed that: The West Central Cooperative Grain Co. paid \$49,000 rent and received \$273,000 for grain storage at Fremont, Neb., and paid \$5,900 rent and received 11,750 for storage at another elevator at Kearney, Neb.

The Farmers Union Grain Terminal Assn. rented an elevator at Spokane, Wash., for \$30,750, and received storage payments of \$84,750. It rented an elevator at Williston, N. D., for \$14,400 and received \$24,040 for storage.

**CRASH 'FALSE ALARM'**

Kelso, Wash.—(U.P.)— The Cowlitz county sheriff's office said Friday it believed a report that an airplane may have crashed in the mountainous area east of Kalama, Wash., was a "false alarm."

The union asks wage increases, three additional holidays and other benefits.
