The Black Tornado thinclads from Medford high school nosed out Grant high school of Portland by 4 1/2 points yesterday at Eugene to win the Hayward relays.

The meet was nip and tuck going into the final event with Medford leading Grant 53 1/2 to 51. The locals put the clincher on the relays by coping the mile relay.

Master Fiddle Wins Memorial

New York — (U.P.) — Myhelyn Stable's Master Fiddle, with a tremendous drive through the stretch, caught Greentree Stable's Tom Fool right at the wire Saturday to win the \$50,000 Wood Memorial by a neck and sent his Kentucky Derby stock soaring.

Fourteen Kentucky Derby candidates raced in New York's first major prep for the Louisville classic but Master Fiddle, third to Blue Man in the experimental handicap No. 2 a week ago, was the only horse in the field to finish covered with glory.

A crowd of 44,250 watched Jockey Dave Gorman lash the front side of the son of First Fiddle with his whip at the head of the stretch and then thrilled to the response Master Fiddle unleashed as he charged to his first victory of the year.
