Work Brings Warning

Salem—(U.P.)—Reports reaching the State Bureau of Labor that farmers are working children under the age of 16 years during school hours brought a stern warning Wednesday from State Labor Commissioner W. E. Kimsey.

He said any farmer hiring a youth under 16 for farm work while school is in session does so illegally, and is subject to the penalties of federal and state child labor laws.

Kimsey further reminded farmers that children under 18 come under the Oregon compulsory school-attendance law.
