Ex-Bank Bandit King Dies in Gas Chamber

San Quentin, Calif. — (U.P.)—Lloyd Sampson, one-time king of bank bandits who used an expensive yacht to carry away his loot, died in California's lethal gas chamber Friday for killing an innocent bystander in the twilight of his criminal career.

The tall, prison-aged killer was strapped in the heavy chair of the apple green gas chamber and the little white cyanide pellets

were dropped at 10:03 a.m. (PST). Whiffs of fumes from the deadly pellets filled the room, snuffing out Sampson's life at 10:13 a.m. (PST).

The 52-year-old killer, once listed among the FBI's 10 most

wanted men, was condemned for the slaying of aircraft worker Arthur W. Smith during the hold-up of a San Diego finance office, May 27, 1948.
