

'Crude' Burglary

Reported at Library

A burglary at the Medford Public Library including a "ransacking" of all offices, occurred between 9 p.m. Saturday and 2 p.m. Sunday, according to Medford city police.

Police described the job as "very crude" and an "amateur's job" in their report. "They were apparently looking for only money and checks," police said, "as typewriters and other machines were not taken."

Missing was \$11.50 in cash and a \$15 check. Entry was made by breaking a rear window, police said, and the department is now checking on suspects.
