Around Hollywood

Hollywood—U.P.—So...atom bombs in Nevada. An A-bomb was exploded in Hollywood Tuesday, too, and in Hollywood fashion this one had to be an improvement over the Las Vegas variety.

This bomb was noiseless and concussionless, took an hour to build, cost \$185, and I stood 15 feet from it and didn't get my poodle hair cut ruffled. It was prettier than those Las Vegas explosions, too.

Hollywood's secret weapon was movie magic for producer George Pal's "War of the Worlds." The plot of this science fiction epic, a refurbished version of H. G. Wells' 1898 classic, was earthlings throwing an atom bomb at invading Martians.

While the Atomic Energy commission was busy popping off bombs in Las Vegas, the special effects wizards at Paramount were exploding their work of art, too.

Regulation Glasses Worn

Being a veteran of the Hollywood wars, I was assigned to cover this spectacle, and it took almost as long to get credentials for this explosion as it did for the scribes who witnessed the history-making Las Vegas blast. Reporters in Nevada had to wear special eye coverings, but I got by with the regulation Hollywood sun glasses.

Hollywood's first land atom bomb was built by the studio explosives expert, two-time Oscar winner Walter Hoffman. He stashed flash powder, which doesn't make much noise or blast, in a 16-inch metal cylinder. Around the cylinder he

planted red, blue, amber and green powder.

The charges were electrically controlled to go off when he pulled a switch. All you heard was a "whoosh." A gas jet provided enough heat to send the smoke 60 feet to the ceiling of the sound stage while three cameras ground away.

"The smoke gets that mushroom effect when it reaches the cold air at the ceiling," Hoffman explained. "We have dry ice up there."

"We tried shooting this outdoors, but the smoke's so thin the breeze blows it away."

MGM special effects men struggled for six months to make an atom bomb for "The Beginning or the End." But that was a water bomb, so the 81-year-old Hoffman had to concoct the land bomb recipe from scratch. First he looked at the Las Vegas atomic explosion on television.

Not for Pictures

"Ehh, it was okay, but it wasn't for pictures," he shrugged. "Mine is more effective. I made it bluish-green. That'll look great against white smoke."

Monogram Studios plans a movie that will show an atom bomb, too—and presumably theirs will be a B-bomb.

ALLERGY AND TONSILLECTOMY

Some medical colleagues for whom I have great respect keep telling me I am wrong about tonsillectomy.

They are convinced that the operation is a uniformly beneficial in various ways, although it falls to do any apparent good in some instances and proves disastrous in a few instances.

That's their opinion, and I'm sure they are as sincere about it as I am about mine. If they didn't believe tonsillectomy is beneficial in most instances they would not advise or do the operation.

I don't know how familiar these colleagues may be with the statistics reported in various medical journals and tabulated in *Children's Tonsils In and Out* (Lippincott) by Albert D. Kaiser, M.D., but to my mind Dr. Kaiser's observations of the efforts of tonsillectomy on Rochester school children do not warrant the opinion that tonsillectomy is uniformly beneficial, although I must say that Dr. Kaiser himself concluded that in some respects children whose tonsils were removed were better off than children whose tonsils were not removed.

Ten or twelve years ago Public Health Reports estimated that there were 1,235,000 tonsillectomies a year in the United States.

Probably not nearly so many now. Doctors are less radical about the tonsils today.

In Archives of Otolaryngology Drs. Hansel and Chang estimated that 160,000 of the more than a million and a quarter of patients subjected to tonsillectomy in a year were unnecessarily operated on. These authors said the 160,000 victims of un-

necessary tonsillectomy really had only respiratory allergy.

Oh, well, we needn't quarrel about that. I mention the 160,000 unnecessary tonsillectomies merely to indicate how I got this way about tonsillectomy.

From time to time come reports of tragic results of tonsillectomy, and these reports, I confess, demoralize me.

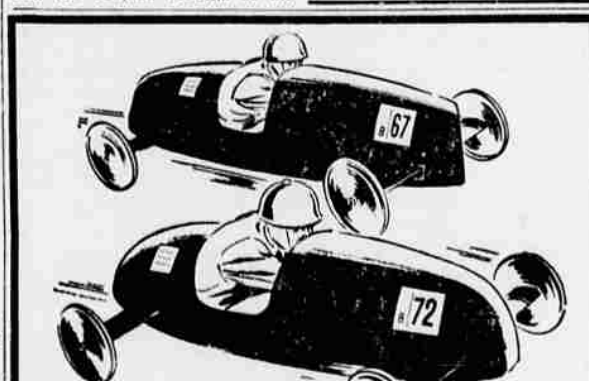

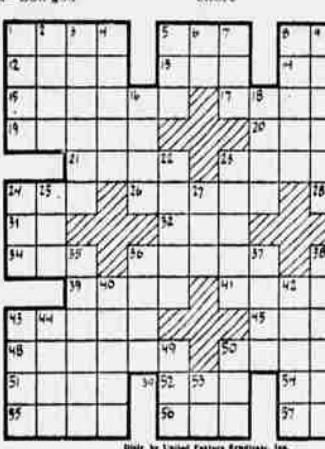
