Europe Said Resting In Period of Jitters

By PHIL NEWSOM United Press Foreign Analyst It's a period of annual jitters in Europe.

Soviet planes and troops are on the move in Eastern Germany, but, so far, only on maneuvers.

However, it's no help either to nerves or frayed tempers to have such incidents as Tuesday's, wherein trigger-happy pilots of two Russian MIG jets sprayed a French airliner with machinegun and cannon fire.

The fact that the plane got back to Tempelhof Airdrome with only two wounded passengers was not the fault of the Russian pilots.

Nor is it particularly soothing to the American soldier on occupation duty in Germany to overhear a Russian message ordering troops to march in his direction, even if he knows its only maneuvers.

Officers know that the Russians could start a forced march by some unit some night, and just keep right on going.

It is into this aura of tension that Gen. Matthew B. Ridgway transfers from hot war in Korea to cold war in Europe.

Ridgway moves into a situation where it is not expected that the Russians will attack this year, but where it is known that they could.

In some ways it will not be so different from masterminding the Korean war. It will just be on a vaster scale. Troops outnumbered.

He will be in command of troops vastly outnumbered by Communist forces drawn up on the other side. And in some ways his situation will be worse than it is in Korea where he finally has been able to organize a defense in depth.

Long Beach, Calif., Termed 'Darndest Over-Rich City'

Long Beach, Calif. — (U.P.)—This city may be small but, as some say, "it's the darndest over-rich city in America and literally doesn't know what to do with all the dough it gets."

The town, which hugs a pleasant strip of sunny beach, is on top of one of the world's richest oil pools. Since stumbling on this multi-million-dollar wind-fall 14 years ago, it has put away an \$80,225,000 kitty and "kitty" keeps growing at the rate of \$20,000,000 a year. Geologists say the oil should hold out for another half century.

However, the city can't spend a nickel of the money except for more oil wells and to keep its waterfront and part of its populace from sinking into the ground as the black gold is pumped out.

The cause of this frustration is that the city's location has landed it in the middle of the tidelands controversy.

Claimed by U. S. Uncle Sam claims this big puddle of oil is his and the city and oil companies have impounded the cash voluntarily while Congress considers legislation to settle the matter.

"Socialism," "Communism" and "nationalization" are some of the charges hurled by defenders of state ownership.

A former senator from California said legislation against the states would provide "any future executive with a legal pass-key to Fascism or Communism."
