I believe, writes a mother who has a head on her shoulders, that if the public would carry on a

crusade for staying at home we would soon be able to get good doctors to deliver us in the home where we belong.

I have never been able to understand why any one could be so stupid, continues this mother (and her letter is all I know about her), as to believe she will be better in a hospital, with all the confusion and routine of such a place than she would be at home. I am the mother of healthy girls and boys. All were born at home. Every one says I look ten years younger than I am. (Signed).

After all, this mother is an old-fashioned one. That's obvious enough, for she has borne five children, hasn't she? Besides, she doesn't say whether her husband shared the miracle with her, because she is afraid it might sound, well, wrong.

The lady's observation about carrying on a crusade for staying at home should interest both doctors and folks -- especially family doctors or general practitioners whose practice is steadily going to the --trick specialists who insist upon obstetric patients going to a hospital.

You general practitioners should collect and publish some statistics of the morbidity and mortality rates for home delivery. The facts would make the hospital business less impressive to prospective parents.

In some communities this hospital obsession has taken such a hold on the fancy of the customers that it is difficult or impossible to find a physician who will attend childbirth at home.

That is indeed a sad omen. It signifies that the general practice of medicine and the general practitioner or family doctor no longer have the confidence of the public. People now want only "specialists" to take care of them -- for much the same reason that a man whose income warrants ownership and use of a bicycle is satisfied with nothing less than an automobile.

The general practitioners in the community -- if any left -- would do well to heed this sensible young mother's suggestion and lend some encouragement to a crusade for staying at home.

When the general practitioner goes along with the hospital idea

and declines to accept cases for home delivery he is playing the trick specialists' game and making a monk--or rather a toady of himself.
