The purpose of this week is to remind the whole public of the moral obligation to be kind to animals. In many cases the Humane Society is an enforcing agency. We do, and may make arrests wherever we find anyone flagrantly abusing or mistreating animals and the mere fact that the person owns the animal won't help him escape conviction in a court of law, either.

Usually, though, we let off an offender with a reprimand the first time. We're trying to educate, not to punish. But where there is repeated cruelty, or in flagrant cases, we go the limit—we prosecute. In our book, cruelty is cruelty and suffering is suffering... and we see no reason why a person guilty of cruelty toward a defenseless animal is any less a criminal than if

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Chamber Directors Send Air Service Resolution to CAB

The Jackson County Chamber of Commerce board of directors Friday passed a resolution addressed to the Civil Aeronautics Board, asking that airline service between Medford and Klamath Falls be inaugurated on a temporary basis "at the earliest possible moment."

The resolution followed by about a week of joint meeting of the chamber's aviation committee with that of the Klamath County Chamber of Commerce.

In the resolution, the chamber's board pointed out that Medford and Klamath Falls are retail trading centers, doing a total trade sales volume of some \$80,000,000 or more each per year, both are distant from metropolitan trade areas, and that the economy of the area requires frequent travel and mail and telephone communications.

There is a great community of interest between the two areas, the resolution points out, but the Cascade mountains separate them, and aside from bus or auto travel over a narrow, hazardous road, the only method of transportation between the two is by air.

Refusal To Testify Brings Halt To Government Timber Sale Suit

Portland — (U.P.) — Two witnesses who refused to testify Friday put a temporary halt to a pre-trial hearing here in the government's suit to cancel a \$135,000 sale of Indian trust timber lands at Gold Beach, Ore.

Defendants Fred M. Marsh, Lebanon, Ore., and John C. Blanford, Portland, each said "I refuse to testify on the grounds that my answer might tend to incriminate me."

U. S. Attorney Henry Hess asked the two, without success, about their dealings with Clyde Flinn, suspended land officer in the Portland office of the bureau of Indian affairs, and with Francis La France, Flinn's assistant who was also suspended as a result of the Gold Beach sale.

Depositions are scheduled to be taken today from Flinn and La France pending a pre-trial conference next week and the trial itself the following week.
