Medics Unhelpful in Violent Death Cases

Chicago (U.P.)—Most doctors are little or no help in solving crimes of violent death, according to a medical expert.

They are reluctant to testify as experts in court and cannot with moderate competence assume the public office of coroner, said Dr. W. E. B. Hall.

Hall, director of laboratories at the Chambersburg, Pa., hospital, wrote his opinions in the Journal of Criminal Law, Criminology and Police Science, published by Northwestern University's law school.

Hall said the medical profession has been derelict in not acquainting its members with the legal aspects of medicine and has "neglected its social responsibilities" in failing to meet the need for this type of specialized knowledge.

He said medical schools should give at least a basic course in legal medicine to their students. Of the 300,000 deaths reported in the U. S. each year from obscure suspicious criminal or violent causes, only 13,000 are officially recognized as murders, Hall said.

Women-at-Work Not Liked by Vets

Sydney, Australia (U.P.)—When it comes to taste in paintings, sick ex-servicemen least like pictures of women at work, the Red Cross art library here found.

The library has been circulating prints of well known paintings in ex-servicemen's hospitals for the last three years.

The sick veterans not only reject paintings depicting women at work, the library reports, but also paintings with sad and sorrowful women as the subject.

"They almost unanimously prefer romantic pictures of women, such as the one in Rosetti's 'Daydreams,' one library worker said.

Ask Domestic Scenes
Paintings of domestic scenes by early Dutch painters, such as "The Fish Shop," are also in great demand.

Extremely modern and controversial paintings interest war neurosis patients, who invariably form discussion groups, the library worker said.

"Patients confined to bed for long periods become hyper-critical of details in a painting and anything suggesting physical disabilities tend to irritate them," the worker added.

The Red Cross Art Library is considered by its members to have immense value, not only from the cultural aspect, but as a form of healing therapy.
