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Gold Hill Budget Special Election Scheduled May 15

Gold Hill--The regular May meeting of the Gold Hill city council was held Monday night at the city hall. It was announced that a public hearing on the city budget would be held Wednesday night, May 14, at 8 o'clock at the city hall, and that a special election would be held on the budget and some charter amendments Thursday, May 15, from 1 p. m. to 7 p. m. at the city hall. The recorder explained that the date of May 13, originally set, would not have allowed enough time for the election notices to be posted the legally required number of days, hence the change of election date.

In answer to a letter from the council asking for a copy of the minutes of the State Highway Commission hearing held in Gold Hill last October on the re-routing of 99 Highway, the State Highway commission wrote that the minutes had not yet been approved. The recorder stated that this same answer had also been received from the Highway Commission in March.

A letter was read from the State Industrial Accident commission, explained a method whereby Gold Hill Volunteer Fire department members could be covered by state industrial accident insurance at a total maximum cost of only about \$13 a month for 25 firemen. The council voted to adopt this plan.

It was reported that the title to the property purchased from the city by Ray Pote was being straightened out, and that the correct legal description would be put on the deed. The recorder also stated that the city attorney, Edward C. Kelly, was working on the matter of having the DeKum addition of the city properly recorded so that titles to property in that section could be cleared without difficulty.

It was announced that for the primary election, to be held May 16, the polling place for the north precinct of the city would be the Grange hall instead of the city hall.

O&C Timber Tract Will Be Offered For Sale in May

Portland--(U.P.)--Forty-nine parcels of O & C timber with a total of 118,157,000 board feet of saw log size and 62,751 lineal feet of Douglas fir and western red cedar poles will be offered during May, the Bureau of Land Management announced Wednesday.

Roscoe E. Bell, regional chief of the bureau, said the timber was valued at \$2,353,688.45. Medford Sale May 20. On May 20, 23,800,000 board feet in eight tracts will be offered for sale at Medford. On the same day the Salem district office will offer 10 tracts with a volume of 34,600,000 board feet and 6,400 lineal feet of poles will be offered for sale at Roseburg. On May 22, the Coos Bay office will offer 10 tracts with 16,908,000 board feet and 54,086 lineal feet of poles. On May 23, the Eugene district forester will place 10 tracts on the market with 11,318,000 board feet and 2,265 lineal feet of poles.

The timber to be offered for sale is located in Polk, Washington, Tillamook, Yamhill, Linn, Benton, Lane, Marion, Douglas, Coos, Jackson and Josephine counties.

Disabled Veterans Will Pay Reduced Fish License Fee

Salem--(U.P.)--War veterans with 25 per cent or more disability can get fishing licenses in Oregon for 50 cents, the State Department of Veterans Affairs has reminded.

The veteran must have been an Oregon resident for one year before applying for the license and his disability must be certified by the federal veterans administration. Same Hunting Fee. The same 50-cent rate is available to the disabled veteran for a hunting license, or he may get a combination hunting-fishing license for one dollar.

Washington--(U.P.)--The Senate passed and sent to the House Wednesday a bill giving the federal government broad new powers to enforce mine safety regulations.

The department also noted that men on active military duty in Oregon can get Oregon hunting and fishing licenses for the regular resident fees, whether they are Oregon residents or not.
