SOC Delegation Attending Mock GOP Convention

Ashland — Fifteen Southern Oregon college students left today for Salem where they will participate in the Mock Republican National convention to be held at Willamette university. Members of the Ashland delegation will represent the states of Missouri, Tennessee, Louisiana, Arkansas and Mississippi in the program patterned after the regular GOP session.

Committee meetings will be held this evening and the main body of the convention will convene Saturday morning under the chairmanship of Robert Small of Willamette. Caucuses will be held during the afternoon and an evening banquet is planned at the Senator hotel with Robert J. Hilliard of Southern Oregon as toastmaster. Senator Chairman Sen. Wayne L. Morse (R-Ore.) will serve as honorary chairman of the Saturday evening nominating session. Keynote address will be presented by Sen. Frank Carlson (R-Kan.) who will be introduced by Gov. Douglas McKay of Oregon. The 241 delegates from 12 state colleges will then select the mock convention's choice for the 1952 Republican standard-bearer.

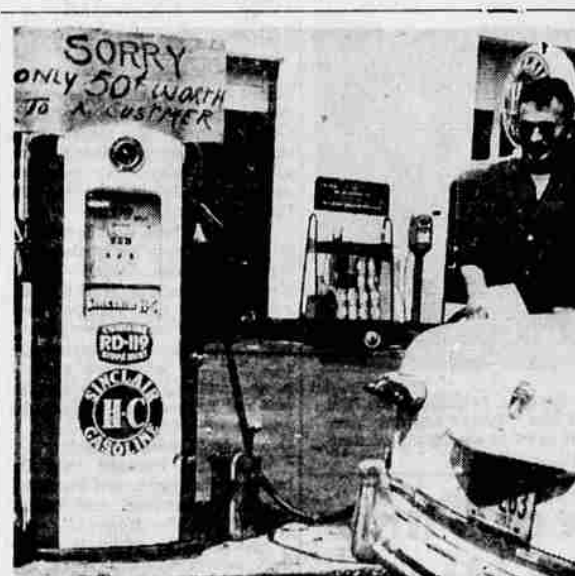
