

Medford High Golfers Annex State Championship

P. Getchell Medalist in Tournament

The class of Oregon for the second straight year, the Medford high school golf team won the state championship in Friday and Saturday 36-hole action at the Albany Golf club.

Paced by Phil Getchell, the Tornado quartet had an aggregate of 606 strokes, nine better than runner-up Grant of Portland, which totalled 615. Other top team scores were Albany 617, Corvallis 636, Milwaukie 638 and Central Catholic 641. Phil All-State

Getchell was medalist and No. 1 man on the all-state team with a two-day card of 71-70-141. Seventy is par. He was seven strokes under the No. 2 all-stater Norquist of Lincoln who had a 148. Also on the all-state team were Zenger and McDonnelly of Grant. They each had 149s. Bill McAllister, Medford, was one stroke behind the Grant pair with 72-78-150. Other Medford scores were Bob Shepherd 76-79-155 and Justin Smith 79-81-160.

Albany — (U.P.) — Phil Getchell led Medford high school's team into the Saturday finals of the Oregon state prep medal play golf tournament over the Albany golf course with a nine-stroke team edge over Grant in Portland in Friday play.

Getchell's 71 and teammate Bill McAllister's 72 were low individual scores for the opening round.

Medford high's track contingent came out second best in the Class A District No. 3 meet at Klamath Falls on Saturday but grabbed 10 spots for state meet contention.

Grants Pass won the district crown by piling up 166 points. Medford scored 128½. Klamath Falls 62 7/9, Ashland 45 8/9, Crater 19 and Illinois Valley 7.

Ed Bingham gained the state mix at Corvallis next week-end with firsts in the javelin and high jump. His javelin throw was 178 feet 5½, his best this year in competition. He high jumped 5 feet 8 inches.

D. Spinias in Three
Don Spinias qualified in both high and low hurdles and the javelin. He was second in the high and first in the low and trailed Bingham for second in the javelin. His time was 21.4 in the low. Jack Moad won the shot put with a shove of 48 feet 5¼ inches. Don Jacobs took the discus with a fling of 140 feet 1 inch.

Dave Newland figured in a three way deadlock for first in the pole vault with a 11 feet six inch soar. He will go to Cor-

vallis. Bill Redden was second for a meet berth in the 220-yard dash but lost out in the century with a third.

Medford's relay team was second to Grants Pass.

Jim Halfhill of Crater ran the 440-yard run in :50.7 for the second week in a row to lead the pack and get Crater a lone berth in the state ruckus.

Other Medford placings were Bob Judd, fourth, and Jim Morrison, sixth, in the shot put; Duane Goodman, fifth, in the 100-yard dash; Moad, sixth, in the javelin; Dennis Davis, fourth

and Don Crowell, fifth, in the quarter-mile; Ron Spinias, Jerry Knapp and Bill Gregory, in a nine-way tie for third, fourth, fifth and sixth in the high jump; Doug Crippen, fifth, in the low hurdles; Goodman, fifth, in the 220; Hal Vrooman, fourth, and Warren Lundquist, fifth, in the half-mile; Roland Thompson, tie for fourth, and Benson Foley, sixth, in the pole vault.

For Crater Rocky Spence was fifth in the discus, Bill Balch fourth in the mile, Bill Crawford sixth in the half-mile and Halfhill sixth in the 100.

San Diego, Calif. — (U.P.) — The San Diego Padres edged Sacramento 3 to 2 in the 10th inning of a Pacific Coast league ball game Saturday when Murray Franklin singled in pinch runner Dain Clay with a run that made the fourth straight victory for the Padres in the series.

The Padres' 10th inning run gave them a little firmer hold on the league's top run, and netted them their fifth series victory of the season.

Relief hurler Al Benton chalked up his fourth straight win after taking over for Bob Malloy in the 8th.

Lou Klein brought home the first tally for San Diego in the second frame when he took first on an error, stole second and raced home on a single by Allen Richter.

The Solons tied the score in the sixth, but dropped behind in the second half of the frame when a pair of doubles by Jack Graham and Lou Klein gave the Padres the edge.

J. Robinson Heads Senior Loop Hitters

New York — (U.P.) — Jackie Robinson is off to a fast start in search of his second National League batting title, but five-time champion Stan Musial can't seem to get rolling.

Robinson, who won the National League crown in 1949, led his Brooklyn Dodger mates back from their first swing through the West with a .429 average. The slugging second baseman had 20 hits in 47 trips to the plate, including afternoon games of Thursday, May 8.

Musial, meanwhile, was having trouble finding his batting eye. The St. Louis Cardinals' classy outfielder slipped to .289 during the past week with 22 hits in 76 at bats.

In the American league, outfielder Sam Mele of the White Sox led all rivals with a .370 average. Mele, who was traded to the Chicago club last week-end by the Washington Senators, boasted 17 hits in 46 plate appearances.

Woodling Second
Gene Woodling of the New York Yankees was second at .366, and Al Rosen of the Cleveland Indians held third with a .361 mark. Pete Runnels of the Senators and Dale Mitchell of the Indians tied for fourth at .348.
