When you pay your telephone bill, about 28 cents of each dollar goes for excise, income, property and other taxes.

How much tax in your telephone bill?

Your telephone is taxed in two ways: One, through the operating taxes we pay to run the business...federal and state income taxes, property taxes and the like.
