Convention Report, Annual Installation Features Meeting

The need for parents to give their children more love, fewer material things, and to instill in them a sense of responsibility rather than obedience was stressed Friday afternoon by Mrs. Alvin Boswell in her report of the annual convention of Oregon Congress of Parents and Teachers to the Jackson PTA.

Mrs. Boswell, who was also installed as new president of the Jackson unit Friday afternoon, was Jackson delegate to the state convention. She returned, inspired to continue in PTA work, she told fellow members, describing the state convention as a "wonderful experience."
