Heroic Stand Wins Honor Medal

Washington — (U.P.) — Corp. John Essebagger, Jr., Holland, Mich., has been awarded the Medal of Honor for giving his life in a heroic one-man stand on a Korean battlefield, the Army announced Wednesday.

The 22-year-old reservist walked into murderous gunfire to stall an attack by Communist troops and permit his buddies to withdraw in comparative safety.

Heavy Losses Inflicted. Essebagger was credited with single-handedly inflicting heavy losses on the enemy and disrupting their advance before he fell mortally wounded near Popsudong, Korea, on April 25, 1951.

Capt. Holger H. Thompson, Salinas, Calif., Essebagger's company commander, said the young hero "accounted for an estimated 14 enemy killed and an untold number of wounded."
