**5 Survivors of Airplane Collision Tell Experience**

San Diego, Calif. (U.P.) — Five survivors of a collision between a B-29 bomber and a fighter plane 15,000 feet above the Pacific Ocean said they never saw the craft that struck

their Superfortress, and only one remembered abandoning the bomber.  
The men were brought here aboard the cruiser USS Toledo, which rescued them from the sea between Santa Catalina and San Clemente islands Tuesday after a Marine Corsair "igh er ramed into the wing of their B-29, sending both planes hurtling into the water.  
**Body Recovered**  
The Toledo also recovered the body of one of the 14 victims. Another survivor was plucked from the water by a Coast Guard PBM flying boat and flown to the Naval hospital here.  
None of the five men taken aboard the cruiser could recollect leaving the Corsair, and only one, S-Sgt. Lawrence I. McLaughlin, Dayton, O., the flight engineer, remembered abandoning the bomber.  
He apparently was the only survivor in the forward part of the B-29. McLaughlin said he felt a "violent crash" and seized the nose wheel of the Superfort, letting it down.  
**Dived Through Hatch**  
Then he dived out the wheel hatch, he said and the next thing he knew, he was in the water. All the men were in good condition, but they were taken to the Naval hospital for observa-

tion.  
First Lt. Emmett E. Muter-spaw, Jr., Middletown, O., said he also felt the violent jar of the crash. He and three other survivors were in a pressurized compartment in the rear of the bomber.  
"After the impact, I tried to depressurize the cabin," he said. "I grabbed for the cable. I dived forward and rolled against the aft turret. The next thing I knew, all I could see was the sky."

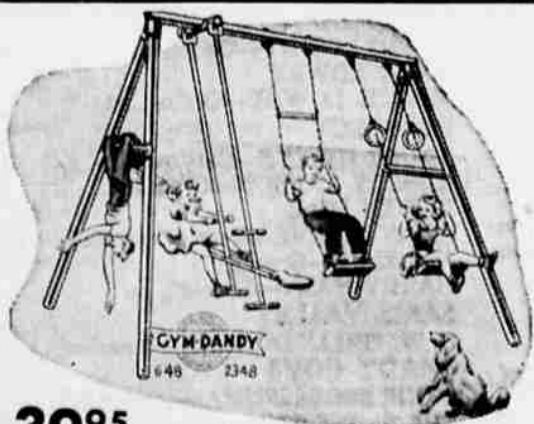
