Attending the bride was Miss Katherine Caraffa also of Philadelphia.

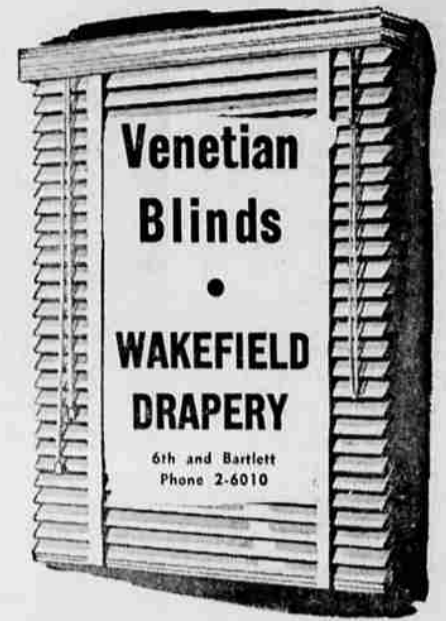
John Kimock Jr., Hazelville, Pa., was best man.

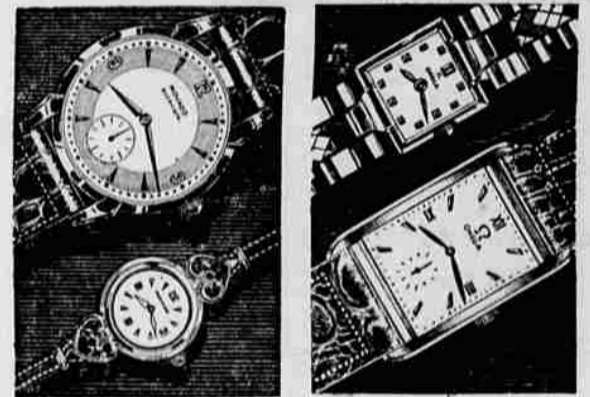
