

## Only About One-Half Of Jackson County's Voters Cast Ballots

Only a little more than half—54.6 per cent—of Jackson county's registered party voters went to the polls in the primary election, it was revealed today following complete tabulation of the vote.

Republicans had a much better voting record than did the Democrats, with the GOP percentage 64.7 and the Democrats only 41.6. Greater interest in the presidential contest, and in contested nomination elections on the Republican ballot, were credited with the greater GOP turnout.

Of the 18,174 registered Republicans, 11,758 voted; of the 13,985 registered Democrats, 5,821 went to the polls.

On the Republican side, more voters marked Xs in the district attorney race than they did for president, 11,372 to 11,758. Among the Democrats, more voted in the election for national committeeman, 5,821, than there were voters for president, 5,394.

Those registered with splinter parties or as independents were not eligible to vote in the primary election.

The committee in charge of the play announced that we will work on it this summer and have it early in the fall.

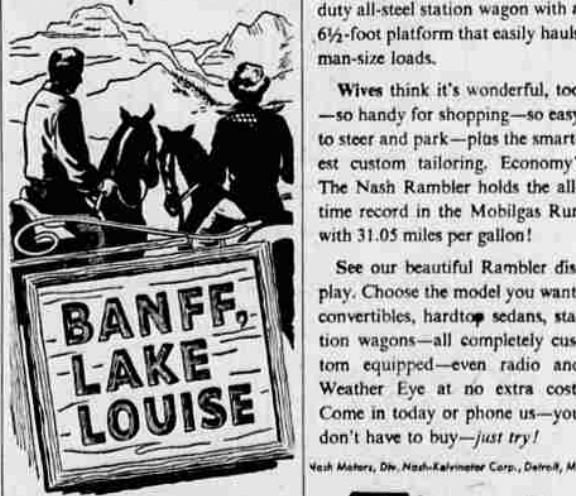
