THE TIN SOLDIER EXTRAVAGANZA

A Montreal reader resents comments in this column concern-

ing the finding of the British Medical Research Council, that wet feet, sitting in cold drafts, sudden change and the like neither cause illness nor predispose to experimental infection with nasal secretions from a person with the cri-

The recognized medical authorities in England reached this conclusion after years of study and experimentation on volunteers.

In halting the report of the Council the arrant quack who conducts this column said:

"Seriously, the conclusion reached by the British Medical Research Council is the most encouraging thing that has happened in the last three decades of this campaign to dissociate respiratory infection from wet feet, drafts, foul weather and everyday 'exposure' in the popular mind."

With that I got in another good lick at the popular "cold" delusion:

"From surveys in various urban and rural sections of the country the U. S. Public Health Service estimated that three-fourths of the illness attended by physicians, medical and surgical, is directly or indirectly due to respiratory infection."

So, you see, I hope, children, that this conclusion of the British Medical Research Council is of great import to public health and to your personal health.

Maybe it would have been better had I let it go at that. But, no, I had to season it, as follows:

"Of course the Research Council didn't use the term 'cold.' The Council, I regret to say, clings to the now meaningless old form, calling it 'cold,' just as the Crown clings to the extravagant and absurd changing the guard at Buckingham and other tin soldier ceremonies . . ."

The Montreal reader deplores the "tin soldier" comment as a cheap, etc. slur upon the Crown, the home of the king and all that.

I resent the Montreal reader's resentment. If there is any question of readers of this column about my admiration and love for the British people — including the late beloved king and his fine family—it must be because such readers are too dumb to understand the king's English.

If there had been a lingering doubt in my mind about the British it was washed away by the tears I shed when I gazed at the blocks of rubble in the very shadow of Westminster and St. Paul's in the heart of London two years ago.

I still say that from the blocks of rubble to the changing of the guard show in London is a step

from the sublime to the ridiculous.
