All Navy mothers are cordially invited to attend, and those needing transportation are asked

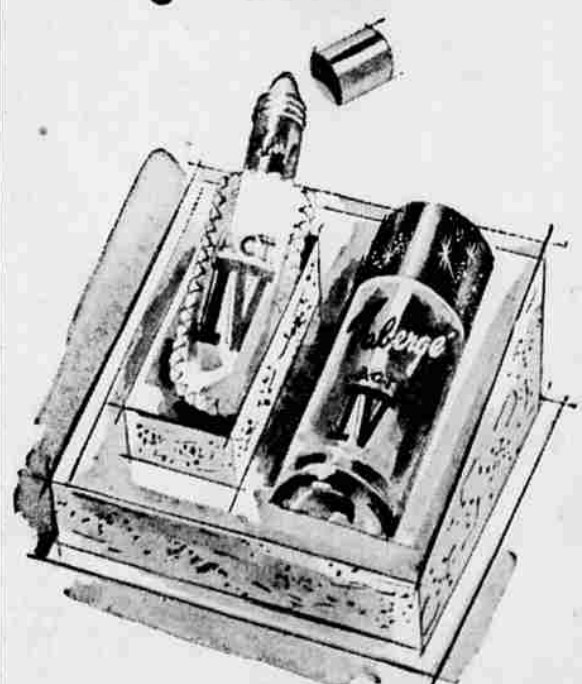
