ELDERLY MOTHER COMPLAINS OF WEDDED SONS' NEGLECT

Grown children, after they marry and go to homes of their own, sometimes become so preoccupied with their own interests that they forget and neglect an aging parent. The parent, after sacrificing the best years of her life for her children, is entitled to better treatment than that. How to get it is the problem that is facing the widow who wrote:

(Q) "I have two sons. Both are married, own their homes, have cars, radios, TVs, etc. They both have children. I am living all alone and working. My one son calls me every day but the only time I hear from my other son is when he comes with a gift at Christmas and takes my gifts to the family. He never even calls me to say 'Hello' on my birthday or Mother's Day. I am lonely but I can't bring myself to push him. My one son has plenty of time to visit friends, take trips, go to a cottage in summer, but he never, never thinks of seeing if I need help or want to go anywhere. He sees his wife's people but has no time for me. How can I bring him to his senses?"

(A) My suggestion is that you invite your two sons and their wives to your home for a Sunday dinner or for dinner some evening. Arrange for a time when all four of them can be present together.

Give them no clue as to what you have in mind. Merely treat it as a pleasant family get-together. Arrange to have your two sons' fa-

vorite foods, have flowers around to give a festive atmosphere to the place, and wear your most becoming dress. All through the meal be gay and cheerful. The important thing is to get them in a good frame of mind for the blow that is coming.

Then, as soon as dinner is over, tell them you want to talk seriously to them. Have all your facts and figures down on paper to read out to them. Tell them just how much you earn, and how much other income you have. List your usual expenses, and then add others that might come in the emergency class, such as a warm winter coat, dentist bills, doctor bills, etc.

Ask all four of them if they think they have been treating you fairly by doing nothing to help you and by never bothering to come to see you. Ask them how they would feel if, at your age, their children never called them up from one Christmas to another. Then see if this is not an eye-opener to make them realize how selfish they have been and to take steps at once to mend their ways.

LET'S HAVE IT OUT ABOUT CALCIUM

With straight face and all the ponderous dignity with which the medical profession expounds legends and theories for I'm still on the — ah, ah, probation — ality, a newspaper health columnist said the other day: "Deposits of calcium in the walls of the blood vessels is (sic) 'the principal thing responsible for hardening of the arteries. Why calcium should be deposited... no one yet knows.'"

Although this bald statement fairly represents the prevailing medical thought, if one can call it thought, about arteriosclerosis or hardening of the arteries, the absurdity of it must be apparent to any medical student or physician who has an elementary knowledge of pathology. Why, away back in the nineteenth century Dr. Osler gave a truer view of it. He said:

"Calcification (that is, deposit of calcium) of the arterial wall follows fatty degeneration and sclerosis, and is associated with atheromatous changes... It is by no means always a senile change."

No, children, calcium is not deposited in the walls of the arteries out of a clear sky. This change in the condition or structure of the artery wall occurs only as a consequence of degeneration.

In view of the wide circulation of this column it is the duty of any physician or pathologist who finds anything wrong about my teaching to point out the error. I promise to print, as the author approves, any reasonable correction or contrary view submitted, and I'll keep the author's identity secret or reveal it, as he or she may prefer.

There is a similar notion in the popular mind in reference to calcium deposits in or around the joints. This causes "arthritis" or rheumatism, according to the legend or theory expounded by many medical practitioners.

Aside from arbitrary statements by doctors whose dignity is offended when patients evince any knowledge of nutrition or metabolism, there is no scientific ground for the fear that "too much calcium" in food, water or medicine, will cause calcification or the deposit of calcium in or around the joints.

In every instance such calci-

fication or deposit of calcium is a consequence of sprain, strain, inflammation or degeneration. If any physician or pathologist differs with me about this I invite him or her to submit a brief statement for publication here and I promise to treat such communication with professional courtesy.

This is the first of a series of talks about calcium. The second will follow in a few days. It is an important subject and I think both doctors and laymen should know more about it.

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Washington—(U.P.)—An AFL union leader late Saturday reported that union voting on a proposal to end the 52-day Western Union strike was "running so close that it's impossible to predict the outcome."

South African Mob Of 12,000 Protests Union Man's Arrest

Johannesburg, South Africa—(U.P.)—Police battled a mob of 12,000—many of them yelling and screaming women—which gathered outside City Hall Saturday protesting the arrest of a union official on charges he violated anti-Communist laws.

Thirty-eight persons in the crowd and several policemen were injured when the police wielded truncheons, chair legs and broomsticks against bottles and sticks.

Come to Rescue
Hundreds of women — black, white and half-caste — surged forward screaming when police

arrested E. S. Sachs, secretary of the South African Garment Workers union. The mob tried to rescue Sachs as police dragged him up the front steps of City Hall and through the big main entrance.

The union immediately issued a strike call, effective Tuesday.

Florence, S. C. — (U.P.) — Officers here arrested Carolina Ku Klux Klan Boss Thomas Hamilton on fugitive warrants in connection with two North Carolina floggings after he arranged to surrender through his lawyer.

A union spokesman said the strike will remain in force "until we get Sachs back."

Sachs was taken to police headquarters, where another crowd soon gathered. The city was quiet by early afternoon but police said they were remaining on a stand-by alert.
