Feuding Families Should Forget, If Romance Blooms

When two people quarrel, it is natural that the family of each person should side with their own relative and harbor a grudge against not only the offender but also against the family of the offender. Family pride and loyalty make a family stick together in times of trouble. How long such feuds will last and how many people they will affect is the problem that is bothering the person who wrote:

(Q) "If people have a bitter disagreement and do not see each other any more, and if later their grown children meet socially or marry into the same family, is there apt to be any bitterness between these young people, knowing of their parents' feeling? Knowing that the children of these people are absolutely innocent, will the bitterness be overcome? Or would there be no feeling of unfriendliness between the young people?"

(A) A family feud is an unpredictable affair. You never know how far its influence will reach or how long it will last. It depends so much upon the feelings of the people involved. It also depends upon the cause of the trouble. If one person swindled another out of some money and this meant hardships for the person who was swindled and for his family, there would likely be a bitterness that would be hard to overcome in that or the next generation of the family. If, however, the bitterness came from a more trivial cause, such as one girl's luring away a

boy her best friend liked, then mature people ought to realize that no question of morality was involved and that all should be good sports on the grounds that "all is fair in love and war."

However, people do not always react in a mature and sensible manner. Therefore, if it is apparent that a bitterness exists between the parents of these young people, it would be wise for them not to become serious about one another unless they want to have a difficult situation on their hands.

While it is true that young people do not marry the family of the person they love, it is also true that the family of that person has a strong and lasting influence on the young person's attitudes and behavior. There is where family feuding will have its weight.

Every year since Tony was a pup some interest or organization has sponsored, endowed or handed out a grant to send out an expedition in quest of "the common cold."

The "scientists" or "researchers" work in this year's expedition ignore the findings or reports, if any, of last year's.

If all the data acquired, observations made and conclusions reached by previous expeditions were carefully studied by the leaders of succeeding expeditions the money and effort expended on these annual junkets might be applied to some useful project.

But that isn't the idea of the "scientists" and "researchers" people who procure appropriations or grants for such surveys. It would never do to recognize any observations or conclusions of previous expeditions when seeking funds for a new one.

There's as much sense in trying to find the cause and cure of "the common cold" as there is in trying to find the cause and cure of that tired feeling or high blood pressure or rapid pulse or headache.

As any physician who is honest well knows, "the common cold" may be anything from a trivial coryza to measles, diphtheria, pneumonia, meningitis, or the early stage of one of a dozen other illnesses.

And any layman who thinks he has "just a bad cold" deceives himself or is deceived by the doctor who makes the phony diagnosis—as a few days time so often proves.

Doctors who indulge in this hanky-panky naturally hate to admit, in the early stage of the illness, that they don't know as yet what may be developing—they're afraid patients will suspect they're trying to make something of it, and go to another doctor who will assure them it's just a "cold," knowing he can make the switch if necessary by shaking his head and explain-

ing that it "turned" to whatever illness does finally develop. Carefully filed somewhere in this Grand Central Station are reports of the experimental studies on human volunteers recently completed in England. Among the conclusions reached by the British investigators is—hang onto your hats, old fogies, lay and medical—that ordinary exposure to cold, draft, wet feet and the like has nothing to do with the C.R.I.—not that the English call it kree, but the abbreviation stands for common respiratory infections, any and all of them.
