### 14 Yank Golfers Advance In British Amateur Play

PRESTWICK, Scotland—(U.P.)—Harvie Ward of Tarboro, N. C., former U. S. intercollegiate golf champion, reached the third round of the British Amateur tournament Tuesday with a hard-fought 1 up victory over Gordon

Dewar of Scotland.

Two other American entries who scored opening round victories Monday gained the third round under overcast skies over the windswept Prestwick course. Felix Salamon, Nyack, N. Y., defeated Sam McKinlay, Scotland, 2 and 1, and Capt. J. M. Anderson of the U. S. Army trimmed R. L. Haggart, Scotland, 5 and 4.

These three joined 11 other Yanks who reached the third round Monday.

A strong wind whipped in from the sea as the second day of the 57th annual tournament got underway.

Frank Stranahan, Toledo, O., began his quest for the title against Joe Gent of England in a second round match.

Those injured were Mickey Mantle of the Yankees, Roy Campanella of the Dodgers, Herman Wehmeier and Ted Kluszewski of the Reds, Cliff Chambers of the Cardinals and Sam Mele of the White Sox.

Mantle, Campanella and Kluszewski were hurt in Saturday's games while Wehmeier, Chambers, Mele and Guglielmo got their "hard knocks" Sunday.

**Pulls Muscle**  
Mantle pulled a muscle in his left leg while running the bases in the Yankees' loss to the Red Sox and will be sidelined for an indefinite period.

Campanella suffered a swollen right thumb in a tag play at the plate during the Dodgers' 5 to 0 victory over the Phillies.

Kluszewski suffered a pulled heel tendon when he slipped on the wet turf chasing a foul pop near the first base boxes at Crosley field in a game with the Cardinals and also is out for about a week.

Wehmeier and Chambers suffered their injuries only three innings apart when hit by line drives in Sunday's Cincinnati-St. Louis opener.

King, a 3-1 underdog, floored DeMarco twice and won a unanimous 10-round decision over him Monday night in Brooklyn's Eastern Parkway arena—right in the "Brooklyn Billygoat's" back yard.

NEW YORK—(U.P.)—We're reeling as they rattled along on charging up on Memorial Day, which has changed from a time of reflection to one of frenzied activity in the sports world, and so fast is the pace that it is difficult to remember the headlines of just one year ago.

No matter what your preference in muscular activity, you can find it Friday. Across the nation there will be 18 race-tracks in operation; Indianapolis presents its famed 500-mile race; Roland La Starza battles Dan Bucceroni; baseball presents a full program of doubleheaders, and Americans play in the British Amateur golf and French Tennis championships.

But what of the heroes of one short year ago?

That was a Memorial Day for Ezzard Charles, as he defended the world heavyweight title easily against Joey Maxim. But now Ezzard is just a challenger getting ready for another shot at the crown.

A little man set a record at Indianapolis as he won the roaring 500 at an average of better than 126 miles per hour. But he'll be watching wistfully from the rail on Friday because Lee Wallard cracked up just four days after that triumph and was burned so seriously that he almost lost his life and probably will never drive again.

In golf, Mrs. Babe Didrikson Zaharias posted a 72 to tie Patty Berg for top honors in the Weather-vane Cross-Country Golf championships. The Babe lies in a hospital bed this week, championing at the bit as she recovers from an operation.

A mediocre stakes runner named Spartan Valor was practically an unknown down in New Jersey. But this Memorial day he's the nation's big horse as he shoots for his eighth straight triumph in the Suburban Handicap at Belmont Park.

### Records Broken By Fast Field At Indianapolis

Indianapolis—(U.P.)—An elite field of racing drivers, the slowest of them with a qualifying speed of 133,904 miles per hour, is set for what should be the fastest 500-mile Memorial Day speedway race in history.

A 49-year-old veteran, Chet Miller, who has driven in 15 previous events, showed the way Monday, shattering the qualifying record with a four-lap average speed of 139,034 mph.

This mark he simply added to a Saturday one-lap record of 139,600 mph which he hung up before mechanical ailments forced him off the track before he finished the four-lap run.

Both marks were established when his car, a Novi Special rated capable of 550 horsepower, wasn't working right.
