The Beavers backed into the playoff Tuesday when Idaho upset Washington 9-5. The Huskies and Beavers tied for first place in the Northern division, but OSC won three out of four from Washington over the season, thus entering the playoff under ND rules.

Second game of the OSC-USC

series will be played Saturday with the third game, if necessary, to follow the same day.

Winner of the playoff series will meet winner of the Seattle — university-Fresno State series on the PCC club's home field for the district 8 NCAA berth.
