Around Hollywood

Hollywood — (U.P.) — Tyrone Power, handsome screenlover of the celluloid, said Tuesday he's temporarily giving up his movie romancing to read a long hair classic around the country.

Ty is known primarily to film fans as a heavy-browed leading man and the owner of a early nude statue of his shapely wife, Linda Christian.

But impresario Paul Gregory, who launched Charles Laughton's "reading" and the famed "drama quartet," though Power had a great reading voice.

So Gregory signed the actor to read the classic, "John Brown's Body," in the auditoriums, armories, arenas and concert halls in 74 cities next fall.

"I hope audiences will be surprised," says Power, "It's a little different view of me for them. It's a great challenge."

Raymond Massey will play Abraham Lincoln in the famous story. Two choruses, one speaking and one singing, will help in the reading with Power serving as narrator and conductor.

Theater — starved citizens of small towns are as excited about "John Brown's Body" as they were when the drama quartet—Laughton, Agnes Moorehead, Sir Cedrick Hardwicke and Charles Boyer — read George Bernard Shaw on tour.

"Power's first engagement is not until Nov. 1, but already the towns are writing for pictures of the chorus," says Gregory.

Other Stars Want Jobs

The impresario picked Power "because I saw him do a good job with a long speech in a movie once." Other stars have since originated Laughton's successful reading tour.

"Shelley Winters wants to read something for me," says Gregory who at 31 has reaped a fortune from the tours.

"Picture stars are interested because they make almost as much money doing this as they do from movies. And the tour is guaranteed, unlike a gamble on a Broadway play."

"It's a safe way to do something they enjoy."

YANKEES LANGUISH ON LOW-CALCIUM DIET

Webster says a Yankee is native or citizen of New England, or an inhabitant of the Northern States as distinguished from an inhabitant of the Southern States, or an inhabitant of the United States. I'll settle for the last — I'd make it the United States or Canada, I have lived with one for several years and I can testify as an expert that the United States never produced her equal.

So I say Yankees languish on low-calcium diet. Not because we—well, my mother was born aboard ship when we were about half way between Clonmel and New York — or James and Margaret Farrell were, so I'm a Yankee—we Yankees are not afraid of calcium, we do not eschew foods that contain much calcium. We just don't know enough to keep our calcium intake up to normal level.

As a recognized authority expressed it:

"The ordinary mixed diet of Americans and Europeans, at least among dwellers in cities and towns, is probably more often deficient in calcium than in any other chemical element."

(Chemistry of Food and Nutrition, by Sherman)

There is more calcium in the body of a healthy person than any other mineral element, about 3 pounds in a vigorous young adult, less in an elderly or feeble person, still less if the elderly person has hardened arteries or chronic rheumatism.

Contrary to a 19th century belief of doctors and laymen the bones of elderly persons contain considerably less calcium than the bones of young adults. There is a steady loss of calcium through the years, and the calcium stores in the bones are drawn upon to maintain as nearly as possible the calcium level in the blood, that is, to keep the blood calcium level where it must be to maintain various important functions at normal. The physiological functions of calcium will be described in a piece to follow.

It is my opinion and, remember, I'm no authority on anything, that this steady drain on the calcium stores in the bones occurs in the great majority of
