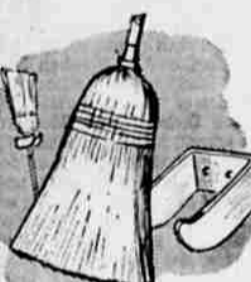

**Crowd Watches Fire Fighting Drills Here; 'Ko Keel' Stars Hit**

A crowd of several hundred persons watched yesterday as a group of Oregon rural fire departments took part in competitive drills as a part of the state fire fighters conventions which end here today. The drills were held at South Grape street and Melrose avenue.

First place in the competition went to the Boring rural fire department. Oregon Technical Institute was second and consolation prize went to Bethel.

The competition consisted of combating a mock fire with

four lines of hose with the three-man team "putting out the blaze" in the shortest time being judged the winner. Medford fire department equipment was used and a Medford driver operated the truck for each team.

A demonstration of fire fighting equipment was conducted by dealers during the afternoon.

"Skill" Demonstrated Hit of the afternoon for most of the crowd was a demonstration of fire fighting "skill" by the Ko Keel Rural Fire Department's "long red underwear brigade." Using a fire truck of ancient, but unidentifiable vintage, the Ko Keel crew used water pistols, hot water bottles, improvised pumps and buckets to wet down each other, the crowd and, on occasion, the "fire."

Members of the Oregon State Fire Chiefs association and the Oregon Rural Fire Protection Districts association, which are convening jointly here, attended a banquet last night at the Medford Elks club. Dr. Elmo N. Stevenson, president of Southern Oregon college, was principal speaker, and R. B. Taylor, Salem, state insurance commissioner, acted as master of ceremonies.
