BOY, 18, SHOULDN'T LOVE GIRL BEFORE MEETING HER

(Q) "I am 18 years old. I know a girl just to speak to her by name. I feel that I am in love with her. I call her up but she only knows me when she sees me. I've been waiting for a formal introduction but I don't know anyone well enough to get acquainted. How should I go about getting a date with her without her thinking that I am a wolf?"

(A) If you don't know anyone to introduce you to this young girl, I am wondering how you found out her name, her telephone number, and the "good bit about her." Surely you have not imagined all of these facts. You got them somewhere.

Go to the person who gave you this information and find out what church this girl attends. Or, if that does not work, then watch on Sunday morning to see for yourself where she goes to church. After you get this information, the whole matter of introduction should be easy for you.

Go to the minister of that church and ask him to introduce you to the girl. Even if he does not know her personally, he would know her family and he could arrange to have the two of you meet through her parents. Under such conditions, she could

never feel that you were a "wolf."

In Love With Ideal
No matter how much you have found out about this girl, you must get rid of the idea that you are in love with her if you do not want to run the risk of being disillusioned. At the moment, you are in love with an ideal, not a real person, and this is bad business.

When you meet this girl, treat her as you would any other girl you just met. It would be quite proper to ask her for a date, but don't talk and act as if you had known her all your life. Nothing could better create the impression on her that you were a "wolf" with a good "line" than just that.

Keep an open mind about her until you know what sort of person she really is. Then, if she comes up to your expectations and dreams, fall in love with her. Otherwise treat her as a friend. By keeping an open mind about this matter, you will save yourself a lot of possible disillusionment.

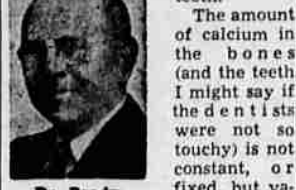

You Can't Feel It in Your Bones

About 98 per cent of the 3 pounds of calcium in the body of a healthy young adult is in the bones and teeth.

The amount of calcium in the bones (and the teeth) I might say if the dentist is not constant, or fixed, but varies from day to day, week to week, season to season, year to year and youth to senility. The bones are the storehouse for calcium and the calcium reserve in the bones is drawn on to keep the blood calcium at a pretty constant level of between 9 and 11.5 milligrams per 100 cc; just as the liver is the storehouse for glycogen (animal starch), blood sugar, and this fuel reserve is drawn on to keep the blood sugar at a constant level of between 7 milligrams per 100 cc. (fasting) and 12 milligrams per 100 cc. (After full meal).

There may be some explanation for the popular belief that valetudinarians, particularly those with chronic rheumatism, can prognosticate change of weather because they "feel it in their bones." Let's leave the explanation to wisest doctors, and for Pete's sake don't try to twist this allusion into an admission that weather has anything to do with the rheumatism. Can't a fellow indulge in a bit of whimsy without reverting with you to the nineteenth century?

It might be a blessing if persons training for chronic rheumatism could always feel it—the calcium deficiency, that is—in their bones and know just what they feel. Perhaps that would make them a little more conscious of the importance of an adequate daily intake of calcium to maintain vete and prevent rheumatism and many other common ailments.

Least some laymen and doctors surmise that I'm expressing merely my own theories about calcium I quote from The Patient Past Fifty, by Ernest P. Boas, M.D. (Year Book Publishers):

"As a result of (inadequate diet) adults experience a steady long-continued loss of calcium through the years. This does not become superficially manifest because the great calcium stores in the bones constantly make

up for the calcium losses in the blood and tissues. But as a result of this constant depletion the bones become poor in calcium and more fragile . . ."

At another place in the book Dr. Boas says:

"The average American diet is grossly insufficient in calcium, and it is quite probable that this calcium lack accentuated by the passage of years leads to the demineralization of bones that is so characteristic of aged persons . . . osteoporosis . . . fractures occur more readily."

It may be a little late to do anything about this demineralization process if it has been going on twenty or thirty years without concern on your part, but it will do no harm to learn more about it—by reading the booklet The Calcium Shortage, for which send 25c and stamped, self-addressed envelope.
