The Jacksonville city council has pledged a contribution for children's books and the Jacksonville Presbyterian church 20-80 club members are donating a book a month for young persons. There also are some anonymous givers.

Regular library hours at the library are 1:30 to 5:30 p.m., Mondays and Thursdays. Anyone having books to give the library may deliver them there during those hours or contact Miss Boeglin at other hours at the Medford library.

Big Chicago Political Show Gets Under Way Prior to Convention

Washington — (U.P.) — The big 1952 political show in Chicago will begin several days before the Republican National Convention meets on July 7.

The first act will take place before the Republican National committee during the preceding week. The committee then will be judging the claims of contesting delegates.

Texans Can't Agree

Texas Republicans this week could not agree on a slate of delegates. Two slates were chosen, one by supporters of Gen. Dwight D. Eisenhower and the other by supporters of Sen. Robert A. Taft. Democrats also split and chose two delegate slates, one friendly to the Truman administration, the other hostile.

Procedures of the two national conventions in judging these contesting claims and those from other states will be similar. There may be as many as 100 contested Republican delegate seats. Obviously, with so many involved, the candidate who can obtain the seating of favorable

delegate factions will have a leg up toward winning the presidential nomination.

To Hear Rival Delegates

The national committee will hear rival delegates and decide to accept the claims of one or the other faction before the convention meets. The accepted delegates will be listed on the convention's temporary roll call. Rejected delegates, however, may appeal to the convention credentials committee.

This committee hears the contestants all over again, but not in time for a decision to be made before the convention is under way with the successful faction temporarily seated. The credentials committee report usually comes in on the second day of the convention. It may uphold or reject the judgment of the national committee.

May Make Appeal

A rejected delegation then may appeal to the convention itself where the issue is decided for keeps by majority vote.

There are some political gimmicks involved in all of this, however. The convention chairman may rule that a delegation which has been contested but which has won a place on the temporary roll call must be barred from voting on contest questions when they come to the convention floor. Or, he may rule that the delegation may vote on contests from other states but not on its own right to be seated. The chairman also may rule, however, that all hands may vote, even on their own right to be present and voting.

Could Give Protection

The candidate whose supporters control the national committee has a long start toward getting his contested delegates seated. A friendly credentials committee and friendly chairman could protect a favorite candidate against almost any assault from that direction regardless of the merits of rival claims.

KYJC Safety Program Gets National Notice

An article on the radio program, "You Never Know," which is broadcast every other Sunday on radio station KYJC, is carried in the current bulletin of the American Association of Motor Vehicle Administrators, it was reported today.

The program is sponsored by the State Traffic Safety division of the Oregon secretary of state's office.

The illustrated article cites the success of the tape-recorded program, which includes actual recordings of the experiences of traffic accident victims, traffic violators and persons connected with traffic safety problems. Most of the interviews are taken at the scene of accidents with a state policeman conducting the interview.

The program next scheduled to be broadcast on the local station will be on June 8 and 22, at noon.

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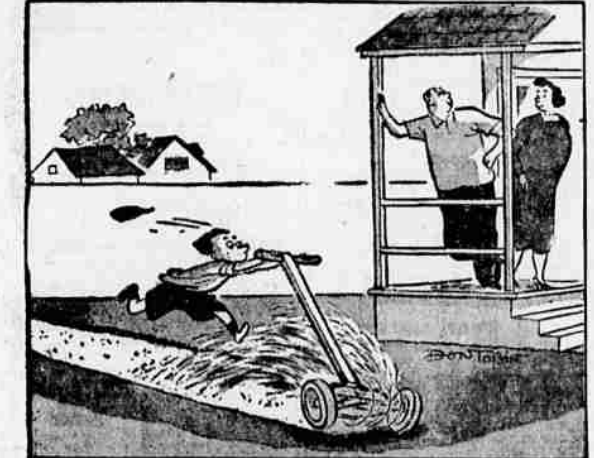
