MAN HOARDS PAY, WIFE HAS TO WORK FOR SONS

Some husbands feel that women should know nothing about their financial affairs. As a result, the wife never knows where she stands and how much she can afford to spend for herself and her children. That is the problem of the wife who wrote:

(Q) "I have been married for 17 years and have four sons ranging from 10 to 16 years. My husband takes care of all the bills and runs the house. I do not get a penny for myself. I worked for the past seven years and put all my money into the house and clothing for the children and myself. Because of an operation, I have not been able to go back to work. My husband tells me it is none of my business what he earns and what he does with his money. He has been seen in night clubs with other women so he must spend money for pleasures but he never takes me out. I pretend before the children that we are happy but I am unhappy and sick inside. Is there any hope that I can have a happy home with him?"

(A) Money matters can break up a home and can make two people who love each other turn into enemies. It is not the money itself or the lack of it that does the trick but the way it is handled.

Your husband's attitude toward his income is enough to make any wife furious. Why shouldn't you share in what he earns and what he does with his money?

Having worked to get the things you needed for your children, your home, and yourself, it is very hard on you now to be penniless and not to know what you can afford. But, at the same time, you must not jeopardize your health by returning to work before you have recovered from your operation unless your

salary is absolutely necessary to keep the family going. If your husband can take other women out to night clubs, he is not penniless and he does not need your contribution.

Ask him to give you an accurate statement of what he earns every week and together make a budget to cover all your expenses. Include money for your own needs and for the children's clothing. If he refuses to cooperate, open up charge accounts and get what you need. When he has to pay the bills, he may decide a budget is cheaper in the long run.

THE EASY WAY OUT

Hemorrhoids—piles—cause various symptoms. Bleeding at stool is one of the commonest although frequently bleeding may occur at any time. When the pile or piles become large enough, the most common symptom is protrusion. At first the protrusion is noticed immediately after completion of bowel movement, but later on protrusion may become more or less constant.

Small protrusions are usually easily replaced—by pressure against the protruding mass—and may not appear until the next bowel movement. After the protrusion assumes a certain size, replacement is quickly followed by recurrence. The protrusion is not particularly painful but is highly uncomfortable and is often associated with bleeding or soiling of the clothing.

It is remarkable that many persons come to a physician's attention with a history of having to replace their prolapsed piles ten or twenty times a day for months on end—sometimes, years. The apparent reason for this type of negligence is fear—fear of what the process may prove to be and fear of pain incident to examination and operation.

Too many persons still do not know that hemorrhoids may be successfully and painlessly treated by the ambulant method. The method is called ambulant because the patient walks into the doctor's office for treatment, walks out after a few minutes and is then free to walk about to his heart's content.

The treatment is accomplished by a series of injections which obliterate the piles. The injection is painless. Indeed, the patient cannot tell when the needle is inserted or withdrawn. The examination preceding the injection is also painless. Very often, following the first injection, the patient finds that his protrusion is permanently relieved. The average case requires perhaps no more than five treatments.

Bleeding very often ceases permanently after the first or second treatment and invariably after the third or fourth. Even where bleeding has been in existence for many years—following bowel movements or at other times—this is the case.

Of course, not everything that protrudes from the rectum is a pile. Enlarged papillae and polyps, for instance, may protrude. While these cannot be

treated by the injection method, they often may be removed painlessly in the doctor's office by minor surgical procedures. The injection treatment of hemorrhoids is designed for one specific thing—internal hemorrhoids. An internal hemorrhoid is one that arises from within the rectum. "Skin tags"—folds of excess skin often found at the rectal opening—are often thought by a patient to be hemorrhoids. It is not uncommon to find a person who spends much futile time and effort trying to "replace" these tags. They cannot be replaced for the reason that they are not displaced in the first place. These tags often require no treatment. When they do, they may be removed by a minor and painless surgical excision.

The ambulant or injection method provides "the easy way out" in comparison to the purely surgical approach which calls for time spent in the hospital, anesthetic and operating room charges in addition to the doctor's fee and the loss of income while incapacitated.
