Satchel Paige Bids For All-Star Berth

 Ol' Satchel Paige, whose glory years in baseball were spent in the obscurity of the Negro leagues, has made a brilliant bid to become one of the pitchers for the major league all-star game next month.

The rail-thin right hander, who is believed to be more than 50 years old, stayed up way past his bed-time Tuesday night to pitch and hit the Browns to a 17-inning, 3 to 2 victory over the hot Washington Senators.

He brought home the winning run with his third straight single. Then he completed 5 2/3 innings of scoreless relief ball in which he gave up just four hits.

Tires of Foolishness

Jim Rivera started the 17th with a double and went to third on an infield out. He was caught in a run-down going home and thrown out after Joe DeMaestri grounded to pitcher Tom Ferrick. But DeMaestri went all the way to second on the run-down and Paige, getting tired of all the extra inning foolishness, promptly drove him home with his third hit.

Paige's spectacular relief chore in which he tantalized the Nats with his slow, breaking stuff and his wind-mill windup, now has a season record of five wins and one defeat. In 29 innings he has given up but 20 hits, 12 walks and has struck out 20. As a showman, he would be a great attraction in the all-star clambake, but he also would belong there on merit alone—if he keeps up his present pace.

Claims Filed in Loss of Freighter

Portland — (U.P.) — Claims totaling approximately \$8,000,000 were on file here Wednesday against the States Steamship company as the result of the loss of the freighter Pennsylvania in the North Pacific Jan. 9.

A petition has been filed by the company in the U. S. district court for exoneration of responsibility. In another petition, the steamship company asked that its liability be limited in the event the court holds there is any liability. Both petitions have been taken under advisement by Federal Judge Gus J. Solomon.

Kin of 39 members of the crew of 46 have filed claims ranging from \$3000 to \$350,000. The government asks \$1,199,647 for cargo lost, two insurance companies seek a total of \$1,000,000 and the Canadian government asks \$24,000.
