Portland —(U.P.)—Negotiations between the AFL teamsters union and the Truck League of Oregon will be resumed Monday. Some progress was reported in a session Wednesday.

The teamsters presented to the league, a management group, contract demands slightly different from those which nearly brought about a statewide strike last week.

**Senate Votes To
Abolish Embargo
On Foreign Cheese**

Washington —(U.P.)—The Senate, after a short spat over whether Italian cheeses are "filthy," voted Wednesday night again, continuing the present embargo on foreign cheeses and other dairy products.

The action means partial Senate acquiescence to President Truman's request for outright repeal of the embargo, which has been sharply criticized by the State Department and foreign governments.

To Protect Farmers
The embargo, scheduled to expire June 30, was written into the Defense Production Act to "protect" American dairy farmers against foreign imports. It requires the government to limit imports of cheese, butter, fats, oils, peanuts and rice when they threaten to reduce domestic production.

In Senate debate over extending the Defense Production Act, Republican Sens. Karl E. Mundt, S. D., and Milton E. Young, N. D., offered an amendment to continue the present embargo. Mundt said it was needed to "protect" American cheese producers from the competition of "filthy Italian cheeses."

**Allies Renew Stand
On Prisoner Issue**

Panmunjom, Korea — (U.P.) — United Nations truce negotiators refused Thursday to "forcibly and violently" return Red prisoners of war to Communism and warned enemy negotiators their "hollow demand falls on deaf ears."

Maj. Gen. William K. Harrison, senior Allied delegate, said the U.N. never would pay the "barbarous price" of forced repatriation.

He again suggested the Red prisoners held by the Allies be rescreened in the presence of Communist observers, after an armistice had been arranged.

**Maritime Official
Faces Embezzlement**

Washington — (U.P.) — Capt. Manuel Gonzales, 42, assistant chief of the maritime administration's ship repair and maintenance division, was arrested by FBI agents Thursday on charges of embezzlement from the government.

Gonzales was arrested in Washington. FBI Director J. Edgar Hoover said wholesale diversion and sale of rope from the "moth ball" maritime fleet at Beaumont, Tex., was involved.

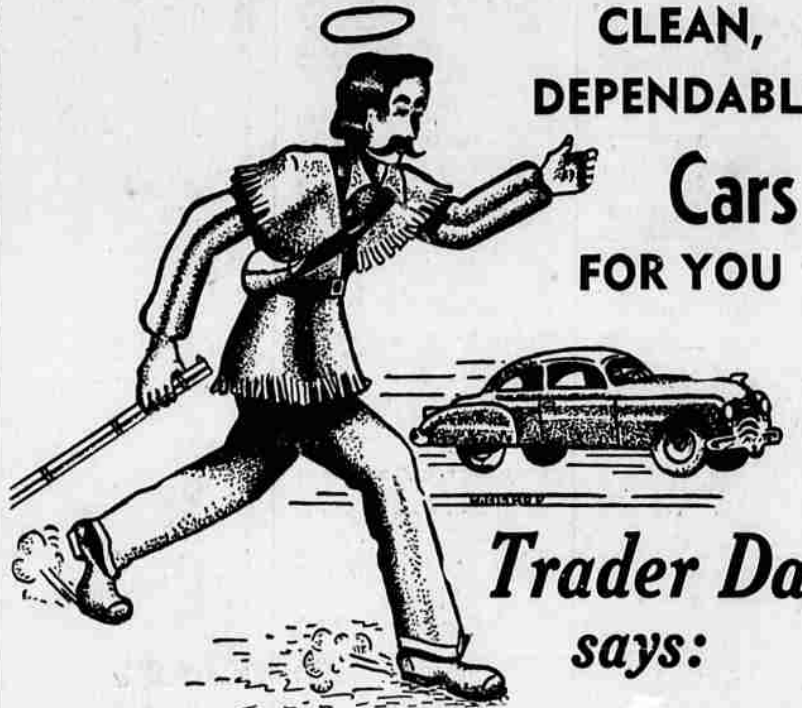
