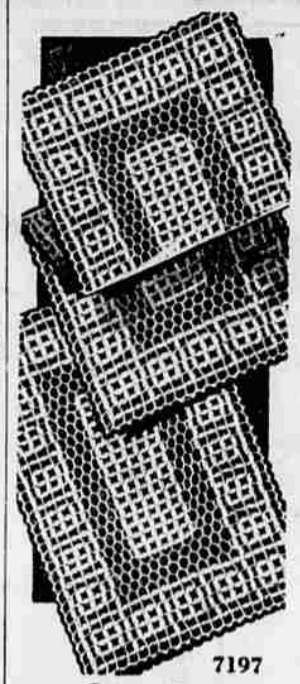

## Plywood Men Hear Reports, Plans for Sales Promotion

Gearhart, Ore. — (U.P.)—West coast plywood manufacturers heard progress reports, made plans for sales promotion and re-elected B. V. Hancock, Portland, president of their trade association at their annual meeting here Wednesday.

**Second Term**  
Hancock, who assumes his second consecutive term as president of Douglas Fir Plywood association, turned the spotlight on buyers' wants and sharpened sales technique in his "state of the industry" message to 300 plywood executives from Oregon, Washington and California.

He said the industry has doubled its output since World War II and sales this year are 10 per cent higher than in 1951.
