Richard Strauss Opera To Have World Premiere

New York—(U.P.)—The world premiere of Richard Strauss' last opera, "The Love of Danae" (Die Liebe der Danae) will be the highlight of this year's Salzburg Festival in Austria July 28 to August 31.

The opera was completed during World War II and was dedicated by Strauss to the festival.

Originally scheduled for the 1943 festival, the opera was ready for presentation when Nazi Germany's propaganda chief, Joseph Goebbels, ordered all theaters closed. Austria's singers and actors were placed in war plants.

"The Love of Danae" will be conducted by Clemens Krauss and produced by Rudolf Hartmann.

The program of the festival will include five operas, three plays, nine concerts of the Vienna

Philharmonic Orchestra and 21 other concerts and musical events.

Other operas to be presented are "Don Pasquale" by Donizetti, "The Marriage of Figaro" and "The Magic Flute" by Mozart and "Otello" by Verdi.
