First Four-Engined U. S. Jet Bombers Arrive in England

London — (U.P.) — Europe's first four-engined jet bombers, of a wing of American-built, B-45 Tornado bombers, began arriving at Sculthorpe, England U. S. airbase Saturday night. The big jet bombing planes will be assigned to the North Atlantic Treaty organization to strengthen West Europe's defenses against the threat of Soviet aggression. Fourteen of the planes arrived at the American base after a mass, cross-Atlantic flight from Langley field, Virginia. It was the first mass ocean crossing by the B-45s. Attached to Jet Wing The planes are attached to the 47th light jet bombardment wing, which will be attached to NATO. They arrived in England after stop-overs at Westover field, Mass., and Reklavik, Iceland, enroute. An Air Force spokesman said other planes of the wing were scheduled to arrive later. The wing will be based at Sculthorpe, under the Third Air Force command and will add a "Sunday punch" to mounting United States airpower in Europe. The B-45 Tornado jets will be able to carry larger bombs and carry them further than

Want Destruction of Property Brings Warning by State Police

Wall Street New York — (U.P.) — Railroad shares set a new high for more than 21 years this week to feature a broad, strong stock market list. It was the most active market since April 26, the broadest since May 10 and it showed the most gains since May 24. The upturn followed the Supreme Court decision against government seizure of the steel mills, and a steel strike that idled 650,000 workers, slowed down railroad operations, reduced coal mining, and threatened to halt automobile production.

Wall Street anticipated a short strike with a settlement of substantially the package recommended by the Wage Stabilization Board. This would set a pattern for other industries, and freeze a new inflationary potential into the economy, the trading reasoned. Dow Jones closing stock averages Friday and net changes for the past week included: 30 Industrials 268.03, up 5.09; 20 railroads 100.36, up 3.07; 15 utilities 50.12, up x0.18; 65 stocks 104.34, up 2.06.

Potato Prices Rise Sharply But Lower Levels Expected

By UNITED PRESS Potato prices, stripped of government ceilings, rose sharply in many cities Saturday, but market conditions and the American housewife were expected to force them back down again next week. Spud prices in neighborhood groceries promptly spurred after the price lid was lifted Thursday, but wholesalers immediately began to throw more potatoes onto the market and the black market seemed dead. May Drop Lower Prices may even drop below the old Office of Price Stabilization ceilings, some market analysts predicted. "The American housewife is the greatest price control agent in the world," a chain store buy-

er said. "She won't let the price of spuds rise too high." Another said he hoped "our customers won't buy" at the new high prices. At San Francisco potatoes were \$6 per hundredweight, with some batches going for as high as \$7, was the most common wholesale price for spuds. Influx Seen Monday Buyers thought that the price would slip Monday when a great influx of potatoes hit the market. They pointed out that much of the crop is of the thin-skinned variety which will turn green quickly if not moved. Executive Secretary Charles H. Bromann of the Associated Food Dealers of Greater Chicago said terminal market experts were "very optimistic that prices will fall below the old ceiling levels as soon as the crop comes in."

Opening Set Today At New Subdivision North of Medford

Grant Acres, a new restricted subdivision now open for sale, is located on Grant road off Beal lane, according to Ray Schumacher, sales agent. Owner of the Acres is N. A. Mead. The sub-division is reached by driving out highway 99 north to Beal lane then following the signs, the agent pointed out. It takes 10 minutes to reach the Acres from downtown Medford, he added, and "each homesite will be plainly marked for price and description." The sub-division is described as having granite loam soil, no mud and on either wooded or level acres, depending on lot choice. The lots are priced from \$1,000 up and are in various shapes and sizes. The larger lots without trees are termed suitable for large garden areas while there are numerous shaded smaller lots back in trees. Schumacher described the water as high and easily accessible for wells. A salesman will be on duty to assist prospective home-site buyers in viewing the various locations.
