New Budget Election Scheduled in Phoenix

Phoenix — The city council at Phoenix has voted again to submit "exactly the same budget to the people as was turned down last Friday by a vote of 85 to 33," according to Mrs. Curt Fisher, city recorder.

She said this decision was based on the conviction by the mayor and council that "if the people fully understand the budget they will pass it." An open public hearing for all interested citizens will be held at the Community club hall June 23 at 8 p.m., and the new election will be held the next day, June 24.

Failure Results Told
The recorder noted that most people don't realize that "failure to allow the money asked for will mean no police department and loss of the city's fire truck, which is being purchased on a lease basis of \$2,000 a year, plus depreciation."

She explained the state law governing budget matters will only allow a 6 per cent increase unless a special election is held for any amount over this. Because the city's tax base is so small, the allowable amount for the last fiscal year (\$269.14) can only be raised to \$285.29 for 1952-53.

Because of this, the people voted an additional \$16,614.46 for 1951-52, she pointed out. This has been cut to \$10,370.91 this year by the budget committee and council raising the minimum water rates from \$2 to \$2.50, which will raise revenues from \$6,000 to \$9,000, including increased water connections, and by increased revenues from the state liquor tax which is general throughout the state.

No Business Tax
Councilmen pointed out that that the proposed business tax is not included in the budget and that salary increases apply to only the police and water departments, where a \$25 monthly in-

Choice of Kader Jury Continues

Portland — (AP) — Selection of a jury to decide the fate of Jada Z. Kader continued Tuesday. Mrs. Kader, who was 22 May 31, is accused of killing her youngest daughter, Sherrie Ellen.

Mrs. Kader sat quietly Monday as 10 out of 14 jurors, including two alternates, were chosen.

The state indicated the trial may last two weeks.

Circuit Judge Frank J. Lonergan denied defense attorneys an interview with Mrs. Kader's remaining child, Vickie, who helped authorities retrace a walk to a dump where Sherrie Ellens' body was found. Judge Lonergan said he would question the child when the proper time comes as to her competency to testify in the presence of both state and defense attorneys.

Wilson's To Appear In Court June 20

Spokane — (AP) — Turman and Utah Wilson, convicted of the kidnap-murder of 18-year-old Jo Ann Dewey of Meadowglade, Wash., must appear in federal court in Walla Walla June 20 to show cause why their

petition for a writ of habeas corpus should be acted upon.

The Wilsons, sentenced to hang June 23, filed the petition in a desperate effort to avoid the executions. Federal Judge Sam Driver granted a hearing on the

petition Monday.
