father. If your marriage is to be a success, you must have co-operation from him. No marriage that is one-sided can possibly succeed. Try taking the offensive side and see how you make out. You have been on the defensive side long enough without success. Tell your husband your meals will be ready at a stated time. Arrange them so that if he is held up at the office, he can still get home on time. Tell him to telephone you if something comes up to detain him. Then if he does not get home on time or let you know when he will be home, you and your son can eat and let him fix something for himself when he gets home. Join some church or community organization and attend the meetings. You should have some fun as well as your husband. Tell him ahead of time when you will be out and tell him you want him to stay with the children. Make a list of your expenses

to show your husband why you cannot get by on what he gives you. If he says he can't give you more, ask him to give you an accounting of what he is spending when he goes out at night. So far as taking your son away, that is a ridiculous threat. You could quickly take the matter to court and tell the judge how little time your husband devotes to his family. 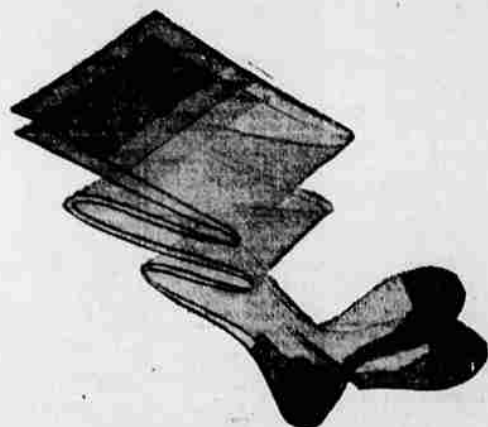

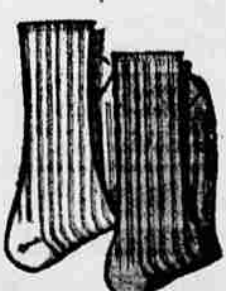

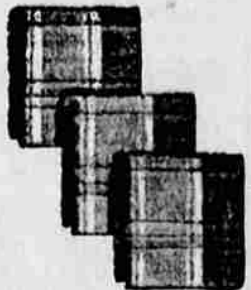
