Proof of Prisoner Camp Location Asked

Panmunjom, Korea — (U.P.) — The United Nations has demanded that the Communists furnish proof that the camps holding Allied war prisoners in North Korea are located where the Reds said they were five months ago.

The U. N. demand was made in a note handed Communist liaison officers at a three-minute meeting at the truce conference site. The U. N. broke off the stalled truce talks Tuesday for three days to give Red negotiators time to reconsider their position.

The U. N. note, signed by senior truce delegate Maj. Gen. William K. Harrison, said allied air reconnaissance failed to bear out the Reds' claim that they have properly marked all their camps to prevent accidental air attacks by U. N. warplanes.

Defenses in Alaska Claimed Insufficient

Seattle, Wash. — (U.P.) — The commander of all armed forces in Alaska said today present military defenses in the territory could not withstand a sustained Russian attack but Alaska would not be abandoned if it were invaded.

Lt. Gen. William H. Kepner was quick to point out that it would be impossible to defend every inch of Alaska's 30,000-mile coast. "But," he added, "if the enemy could seize some part of it, we'd hit him from the air immediately."

"I'd need help in a hurry if the Russians moved large numbers of troops against us," he said. "And I think they could do it."

Action on Hell's Canyon Dam Delayed Indefinitely

Washington — (U.P.) — The House Reclamation Subcommittee has postponed action indefinitely on a bill to authorize the controversial Hell's Canyon dam on the Idaho-Oregon border.

The action was unanimous and apparently ends any chance for approval of the bill during this session.
