South African Riot Kills One, Hurts Many

Capetown, South Africa — (U.P.) — One person was dead and several others under treatment for injuries Thursday after rioting in the Orange Free State town of Odendansrus.

Police used batons and tear gas to break up the disturbance which developed over a new local regulation requiring native women to carry employment permits. Native women traditionally have opposed any new rules to curb their freedom.

Mrs. Kader Tried To Quiet Vickie, Detective Claims

Portland — (U.P.) — Detective Albert Eichenberger testified at the first degree murder trial of Mrs. Jada Z. Kader Wednesday that the 22-year-old mother tried to prevent her daughter, four-year-old Vickie, from talking to police.

Eichenberger related he visited Mrs. Kader the day after she reported her younger child, three-year-old Sherrie Ellen, had been kidnapped. While he was there she objected to Detective William Braly questioning Vickie, according to Eichenberger.

Mrs. Kader is accused of causing the death of Sherrie Ellen and then throwing the child's body into a sump hole of a southeast Portland gas works.

Other testimony concerned Mrs. Kader's background.

Yugoslavia Drops Staff From Bulgaria

London — (U.P.) — Yugoslavia is withdrawing its entire embassy staff from Bulgaria with the exception of one attache, the official Tanjug Yugoslav news agency said Wednesday night.

The news agency said the Yugoslav decision was made to protect Yugoslav representatives in Sofia after the return Wednesday night by the Bulgars of the Third Yugoslav note protesting the arrest of an alleged citizen June 9 in the court yard of the Sofia embassy.

Camas Valley Man Waits Manslaughter Sentence

Roseburg — (U.P.) — Daniel Webster Smith, 70, Camas Valley, Ore., will be sentenced on a manslaughter charge Friday by Circuit Judge Carl E. Wimberly.

Smith was found guilty of manslaughter Wednesday in connection with the shotgun slaying of John Henry Jenkins at Camas
