He then joined the service and went overseas. During this time, he wrote me asking for another chance. Finally I felt sorry for him and said I would give him another chance. Recently I met someone where I work and we fell in love with each other. He wants me to divorce my husband and marry him. I want to marry him but I keep telling him I can't find any way to break my promise to my husband. I know that one of them will have to be hurt. I don't know what to do—go to the one I love or go with the one I promised. Please help me."

I can't see that you have any problem. You married a man whom you loved and you and he are the parents of a child who needs both of you. You promised your husband that you would give him another chance. So far, you have not been able to fulfill your promise because your husband is

overseas. That, however, does not free you from your promise. Whenever he comes back, even several years from now, you will still be under obligation to give him and your marriage another try.

Having given your husband this promise, you were wrong to go out with another man. Surely he knew that you were planning to take your husband back. It was, therefore, wrong of him to ask you to marry him. And, for this wrong, he is the one who should be hurt.

576,510 Employed Workers in State, Census Discloses

Washington—(U.P.)—The Bureau of the Census said Wednesday employed workers in Oregon at the time of the 1950 census numbered 576,510, an increase of 197,822 employed persons from the 1940 census figures.

A break-down of the figures showed there were 424,204 male workers and 152,306 women workers at the time of the 1950 census. Ten years earlier employed males numbered 302,554 and employed women 86,244. Manufacturing employed the largest percentage of workers in 1950, with 130,609, compared with 81,409 in 1940. Wholesale and retail trade was the second largest group with 118,388, compared with 73,814 in 1940. Agriculture, forestry and fisheries furnished employment to 73,205 in 1950, compared with 73,440 in 1940. Employment in construction more than doubled in the ten year period from 20,885 to 42,927.

Salem—(U.P.)—Albert William Karnes, 24, confessed ex-slayer of 82-year-old Mrs. Susan Litchfield in Salem June 7, was arraigned late Monday before Marion County District Judge Val D. Sloper.

Karnes waived preliminary hearing and was bound over to Marion county grand jury on a first degree murder charge.

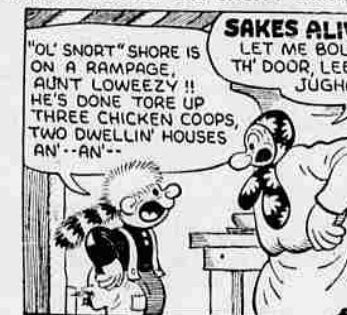
