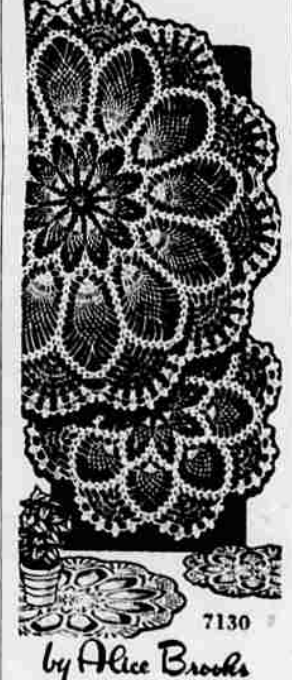

University Gallery Exhibits Paintings Of Valley Artist

A large exhibit of the work of Fritz Wertz, well known Rogue Valley artist, opened last evening at the art gallery in Erb Memorial Student Union building at the University of Oregon, Eugene.

A total of 154 paintings and sketches make up the exhibit. Opening of the exhibit was timed to coincide with the opening of summer session at the university, and with a reception to be held in the gallery Tuesday night. The reception honored faculty members, teachers, and new members of the university board.

The show will remain open for a month. Mr. Wertz states that included in the exhibit are sketches and watercolors of old buildings, docks, fishing boats and other interesting subjects at Newport and Yaquina bay; scenes from the Brookings, Chetco and Crescent City area; old street scenes and historical buildings at Jacksonville; Rogue river valley farms showing fowls and animals; Table Rock scenes; seven circus paintings which Mr. Wertz did of the Clyde Beatty circus; one of the covered bridge, Wimer; paintings made of the Jackson County Sheriff's Mounted posse and the barns near Medford; scenes in Medford and Ashland, portraits of the artist and his wife and the remaining pictures left in the Gold Hill "old-timer" portrait series.

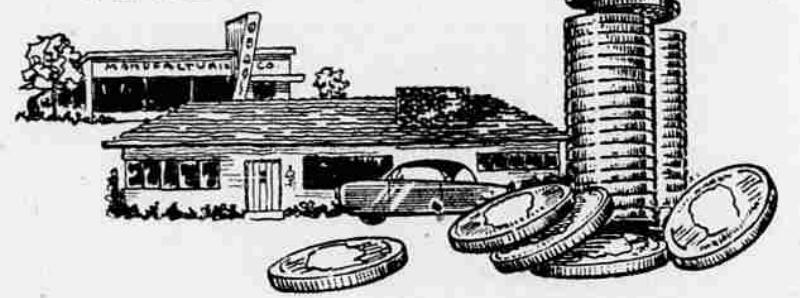
